The PAMB meeting started at 10:07 am with a prayer led by Mr. Efriel Dalabajan followed by the singing of the National Anthem.

## B. MEETING PROPER

### I. Determination of Quorum

Ms. Faith Bangalisan made a roll call of members and declared the presence of 29 out of 43 PAMB Enbanc members.

### II. Call to Order

In the absence of the PAMB Chair, Municipal Administrator Raffy Cabate nominated Hon. Rosano Llanera, the SB Chair for Environment to be the presiding officer and was duly seconded by Mr. Conrado David.

Majority of the members voted Hon. Llanera to be the presiding officer.

### III. Presentation and approval of the provisional agenda

The Presiding Chair presented the provisional agenda. PASu Mildred A. Suza requested to include the presentation on the lifting of moratorium. Hon. Antonio D. Cabelas, Jr. also

Mr. Conrado E. David motioned for the adoption of the provisional agenda and it was seconded by Admin Cabate.

#### **IV. Review and approval of the Minutes of the previous meeting**

The presiding officer sought for comments, clarifications or corrections in the minutes of the previous meeting.

Mr. David commented in line 507 to rectify the word “monthly” to “quarterly”.

It was noted by the Secretariat.

Mr. David motioned for the approval of the minutes of the previous meeting, duly seconded by Hon. Ricky Ballena. The Committee members unanimously adopted and approved the minutes of the previous meeting.

#### **V. Matters arising from the previous minutes**

There were no matters arising from the previous meeting. Hence, the Board decided to proceed with the business of the study.

#### **VI. Business of the day**

##### **1. Comments on the request for lifting of moratorium**

Ms. Michaela Rongavilla presented the comments on request for the lifting of moratorium on the issuance of permits for the construction of new building and any improvements of existing structures within the municipality of El Nido.

Continued imposition of the moratorium for the issuance of all permits for the construction of new buildings and any improvements on existing structures in El Nido until the concerned LGU, PA Management Office and ENTMRPA Management Board have complied and/or acted on the following measures:



1. For the PAMO and PAMB to update the PAMP including the management zones based on the result of the carrying capacity study and in consideration of the following in the designation of the Strict Protection Zone (SPZ)
2. The PAMB and PAMO to translate the carrying capacity study recommendations into various management strategies through updated PA Management Plan to be adopted by the PAMB through a Resolution
3. For the PAMB, PAMO and concerned LGU to rehabilitate areas susceptible to erosion
4. For the PAMO to coordinate with EMB for the establishment of permanent water quality monitoring stations
5. For the PAMB in collaboration with the Local Government Unit of El Nido to impose measures addressing the various issues on water quality and land uses
6. For the DENR Regional Office and PAMB to monitor the implementation of the above-mentioned measures and submit a quarterly report to this Office through BMB

Mr. Jame Mission, the representative of Hon. Edgardo Salvame commented to include the fisherfolks, Punong Barangay at stakeholders on the lifting of moratorium, he added to expedite the carrying capacity study for the water quality.

Ms. Rongavilla answered that DENR can set guidelines. She also added that water quality will take time to recover. No deadline was mentioned on the recommendations but there must be a water quality monitoring areas to determine the unsafe areas for swimming.

Mr. Arvin Acosta further suggested to re-visit the drafted ordinance regarding the carrying capacity with the new Sangguniang Bayan (SB) Committee on Tourism with the Committee.

Admin Raffy Cabate commented that the results were generalized. The researchers relied on the old Comprehensive Land and Water Use Plan (CLWUP) and did not visit the on-going drafting of new CLWUP which is already adopted by the council and presented to the Sangguniang Bayan. He further added that according to the new CLWUP, only the town proper is crowded. He also suggested that areas identified as not crowded must not strict development.

Ms. Rongavilla answered that it can be relayed to the researchers. She also informed PASu to make progress report pertaining to the conditionalities of the study, to keep the higher offices informed that the lower ground have on-going activities. The recommendations mentioned by Admin Cabate can be included, if possible to lift the moratorium.

Ms. Rhodora Ubani suggested, if applicable to make a resolution regarding carrying capacity and include on the whereas the efforts/on-going activities and the recommendation to request a new study.

Ms. Rongavilla answered that they will check to the higher office regarding on the re-study and we can only expedite the lifting of moratorium if the PAMO, PAMB and LGU will comply with the conditionalities of the study. She further emphasized that a study was already conducted, and if the Board have suggestions, re-visit the study, list down the questions and make a progress reports.

Mr. Leo Manlavi suggested to present again the results of carrying capacity study.

It was agreed by the presiding officer and suggested to create a a team with LGU, PAMO and others to thoroughly review the study and list the queries prior re-presentation.

PASu Suza also agreed with the suggestion of Mr. Manlavi and suggested to make a resolution regarding the re-presentation and submission of progress reports to the higher office. Out of six conditionalities, one is already on-going which is the Water Quality Monitoring Areas (WQMA).

Ms. Rongavilla added that PAMB can create certain team to re-visit the study and clarify the queries of Board before the re-presentation while the LGU and PAMB is working to meet the conditionalities mentioned. Incorporation of new CLWUP must be mentioned in the resolution also to guide the researcher for revisions.



The presiding officer asked the Barangay Chairpersons if they are willing to participate on the proposed meeting with the researchers, private sector and other agencies. Majority of the Board agreed that they will attend.

Without further queries, Mr. Conrado David motioned to create a special committee to review the results and recommendation and list their queries before the meeting. It includes Local Government Unit (LGU), Protected Area Management Board (PAMB), Protected Area Management Office (PAMO), Researchers Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB), Private Sector and Barangay Chairpersons. The meetings will be funded by IPAF. It was seconded by Mr. Jose Alferez.

## **2. Green Economy Model (GEM) Master Plan presentation**

In behalf of CENRO Alan L. Valle, Ms. Lucila G. Candelega presented the updates on the Green Economy Model (GEM).

She further explained that most of the inventoried establishments were closed during the inspection/inventory. Caretakers/guards were hesitant to disclose any information about the area; some were hostiles. Some structures have titles and/or basis of occupation within the area.

Mr. Jame Mission asked of what are the plans to the establishments that did not vacate the area.

Ms. Candelega answered that as of today, they are not issuing Notice To Vacate (NTV). Show Cause order was issued to them temporarily and when inventory ends prior to issuance of show cause order, they are required to justify their occupation over the area. She further added that DENR do not have authorities to conduct demolition. It was one of the mandates by the LGU.

Ms. Virginia Balderas commented that El Nido has already Sewage Treatment Plan (STP), she asked why some are not connected.

Ms. Candelega answered that it was also included on the GEM plan. By the year of 2028, 85% of household and commercial establishments must be connected to STP. She further called the attention of Municipal Economic Enterprise and Development Office (MEEDO) and Province on how to address the matter.

Mr. Mission asked the barangays if they are prepared to be highly organized.

Mr. David mentioned that maybe the province have issues regarding this matter.

Hon. Antonio Cabras, Jr. suggested to create a resolution to expedite the Protected Area Suitability Assessment (PASA) instead.

PASu Suza answered that establishment of marker in coastal areas was under GEM project in compliance with the Department Administrative Order (DAO) 2021-07. While regarding the PASA, she informed Hon. Cabras Jr. that PAMO already went to six barangays and will visit all barangays for consultation. The consultation was crucial because we cannot remove areas or add without valid reason since we are already a protected area. The DENR was also coordinating with the LGU, regarding the relocation areas for those affected by the 40 meters easement.

Ms. Rongavilla added that modification of boundaries was part of PASA and requires the participation of barangays.

Hon. Rodante Reynoso stated that the implementing the 40 easement is not standard. Some commercial establishments are still operating near the beach. He further asked if they have special permits.

Ms. Rongavilla answered that the implementation is uniform to all. The dilemma in El Nido was when Task Force was implemented they followed the Presidential Decree 1067 or the Water Code of the Philippines with 3 meters easement. But when ENIPAS was adopted, it was specified that 40 meters must be implemented. They are also coordinating with the higher office



on how to handle El Nido. She further added that PASA was one of the steps for legislation and provisions under ENIPAS not applicable in El Nido will be specified in House Bill.

Ms. Rongavilla added that case files regarding resorts and other establishments not complying on environmental laws will be re-visited.

Ms. Ubani added that resorts had been issued FLaGT before even they are inside PA. SAPA should be their tenurial instrument.

Ms. Rongavilla added that FLaGT's was issued prior to implementation of SAPA guidelines which was issued on 2007 (DAO 2007-17).

PASu Suza also added that CENRO have quarterly or semestral compliance monitoring with other agencies to validate their operation particularly in water the easement. It was already reported to higher office and waiting for further instruction.

The Board requested to present the compliance of establishments granted with Forest Land Use Agreement for Tourism (FLaGT) purposes, specifically in islands. DENR CENRO Taytay to present the compliance monitoring report of FLaGT within ENTMRPA

### **3. Presentation of updated ECAN Map of El Nido, Palawan by the Palawan Council for Sustainable and Development**

Mr. Mark Dela Cruz presented the updated ECAN Map of El Nido for adoption and integration to Protected Area Management Plan. He discussed the criteria in zoning the terrestrial ECAN Zones based on PCSD Resolution No. 21-770.

**Core zone** - Areas above one thousand (1,000) meters elevation; All types of natural forests including first growth forest, residual forest, edges of intact forest, closed-canopy forest, karst forest, and forest over limestone; or peaks of mountains; or areas with very steep gradients, unless the landscape of such forest, mountain and/or area has been modified for a different form of land use; and, Habitat of endangered and rare species.

No activities allowed except for traditional uses of IP/ICC for minimal and soft impact gathering of forest species for ceremonial and religious purposes.

**Restricted Use Area** - Areas identified and declared as Ecosystem Restoration and/or Rehabilitation Areas by the council, based on available science; and, This may include the following: Critical Watersheds, Critical Habitats, Wildlife/Biodiversity Corridors, Biodiversity Hotspots, High-conservation value areas, or areas under "Other Effective Area-based Conservation Measures (OEACMs) declared or recognized as such by the Council.

Limited and non – consumptive activities which include:

- Gathering of Non – Timber Forest Products (NTFP's)
- Almaciga tapping
- Soft – impact recreational activities (hiking, sight – seeing, bird watching)
- Research
- Sustainable activities of Indigenous peoples
- Ecosystems restorations or rehabilitations
- Ecotourism activities as per PCSD Resolution 06-270

**Controlled Use Area** - Areas which may be identified and designated as such by the Council based on available science, which may include, but not limited to, tenured areas granted by the government. This may include an area within the criteria of the Restricted Use Zone which has a community therein.

- Almaciga Tapping
- Tourism Development
- Research
- Grazing
- Gathering of NTFP's



**Traditional Use Area** - Edges of intact forest (including ecotones) where traditional land use is already stabilized or is being stabilized.

- Upland Stabilization Program
- Catchment Management
- Hillside Farming
- Industrial Tree Plantation
- Reforestation
- Integrated Social Forestry
- CBFM

**Multiple Use Zone** - Landscape has been modified or will be modified. These include, but are not limited to, agricultural lands, alienable and disposable (A&D) lands, and mineral lands, which have been declared as such by the DENR in consultation/coordination with the Council, except those area that the Council has declared or recognized as a critical habitat, watershed reserve, protected area, and/or national park.

He further discussed the changes in terrestrial ECAN zonation.

The Barangay Chairpersons requested a copy of maps presented and furnish PAMO the shapefiles of maps.

Mr. Dela Cruz agreed and informed them that they will disseminate tarpaulins.

**4. Presentation of the Illegal Unreported and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing Index and Threat Assessment Tool (I-FIT)**

Ms. Ana Liza Marasigan presented the Illegal Unreported and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing Index and Threat Assessment Tool (I-FIT).

She further discussed that I-FIT is a collection of “tools” to (a) assess the status of IUU fishing in a given area, (b) identify other longer-lasting and targeted solutions to reducing IUU fishing, and (c) track the progress towards preventing, deterring, and eliminating IUU fishing in Philippine waters across various levels of governance, from municipal waters to fisheries management areas to the entire country

She also discussed the IUU Fishing Assessment Guide, complete guide kit for facilitating a 1-day workshop to assess IUU fishing prevalence, vulnerability, and responses in an area of interest, focused on stakeholder discussion and diving deep into the IUU fishing issues. Required workshop to fill out IUU Fishing Index Scoring Form and IUU Fishing Reduction Planning Guide

She also added that if PAMB want to have their own reduction plan for El Nido, it can be requested to Fishright. The Board agreed to refer this matter on Conflict Resolutions Committee (CRC) for further formulation of reduction plan.



5. Clarification on RA 11038, ENIPAS Section 11. Protected Area Management Office (PAMB)

Ms. Michaela Rongavilla presented the Administration and Management of Protected Areas – Section 11 of RA 7586 or the NIPAS Act of 1992, as amended by RA 11038 or ENIPAS Act of 2018, to promote awareness and common understanding of RA 11038 and its IRR specifically on the provisions and rules relative to the administration and management of protected areas.

She thoroughly explained the composition of PAMB, appointment and term of office, representation of women, existing members, organizational structure, compensation, accountability, quorum, grounds for removal, prescribed Technical Working Committee (TWG), powers and functions of PAMB and PAMO.

Hon. Llanera commented that during formulation of PAMB members, it was mentioned in ENIPAS that they can add members, but it was not mentioned on the presentation of Ms. Rongavilla.

Ms. Rongavilla answered that in PA's they have IRR that needs to be followed but in some agenda needs expertise, the Board can invite a resource person or department heads. Municipal mayor must designate a permanent alternate. There must be a smooth transition to finalize the composition according to the existing rules and regulations this year. If possible, next year we will have a new set of members with appointment from DENR Secretary for non-ex officio members such as NGOs, POs, IPs/ICCs, Academe Institution, Private Sector and representative of Regional Directors of DA, NEDA, DOST, PNP and DND. She further added that the PAMB can add members once it was legislated including the boundaries and easement issues.

Mr. Dominador Peñaranda asked the process of removal when a member had 3 consecutive absences

Ms Rongavilla answered to categorize the absences in Manual of Operation. Definition of un-excused and excused absences may also included. The PAMB can elaborate the absences matter since they are the policy making body. She further added that only regular and its permanent alternate can be the presiding officer in absence of the PAMB Chairperson with a voting power, while in barangay level, it was required that the chairperson is present because their official representative do not have a voting power. Ms. Rongavilla emphasized that they must maximize their participation since they are the most affected on the decisions made by the Board.

Hon. Allan Tanaleon asked if the presiding chair can be a tie-breaker.

Ms. Rongavilla answered that it is possible but if there's no quorum, the barangay chairperson must attend.

Admin Cabate asked if official representative of Mayor and Barangay Chairpersons have a voting power.

Ms. Rongavilla clarified that only official representative of Municipal Mayor is allowed including Governor, District representative, Senator, DA, NEDA and DND.

She further added that resource persons to be invited, depends on the agenda and they do not have a voting power. And reiterated that only permanent alternate of a regular member can be the presiding officer in absence of the PAMB Chairperson.

Mr. Jame Mission suggested to include SB and Vice-Mayor because according to the Republic Act No. 7160. An Act Providing For A Local Government Code Of 1991, they must be unseparated. He further suggested to review the legislation and boundaries of PA.

Ms. Rongavilla answered that overlapping in laws happens but we follow the recent laws as it has repealing clause. She further specified that the participation of Municipal Mayor in PAMB covers the entire municipality, the same with the Provincial representative. She further added that, the PAMB should follow the compliance to ENIPAS, unless subsequent site specific legislation was enacted with amendments and additional members.



494 She also added that existing composition can be justified by the old IRR but, she  
495 encourage the PAMB to slowly comply with the PAMB composition based on RA 11038 before  
496 this year ends.

## 497 **6. Biodiversity Monitoring System (BMS) report**

499 CMEMP Extension Officer Mariel Paladan presented the results of Biodiversity  
500 Monitoring System (BMS) conducted within ENTMRPA. The following are the issues,  
501 observations encountered during BMS.  
502

- 503 1. Permanent structure (El Nido Water System) built within the established transect walk  
504 monitoring site particularly in Sitio Bulalacao, Bgy. Pasadeña. During the monitoring,  
505 the team observed newly constructed houses within the A&D areas particularly at Bgy.  
506 Manlag and Aberawan, El Nido, Palawan. The team proposed to establish new  
507 monitoring sites.
- 508 2. Mild coral bleaching due to infestation of Crown of Thorns (COTs) was observed  
509 during the transect swim. To conduct COTs collection with other agencies.
- 510 3. While during the Focus Group Discussion (FGD), number of catches of fish declined  
511 due to weather condition and extraction of terrestrial resources used for firewood,  
512 fencing, outrigger of boats, and housing materials has also declined due to livelihood  
513 conversion. Over all, Unregulated fishing by transient fishermen (Basnig and  
514 Lintigan), was also observed by the participants. It was recommended to strengthen  
515 seaborne patrol and monitoring and formulate policy regarding marine management  
516 zoning. The PAMO also conducted regular patrolling within PA. In addition, improper  
517 disposal of wastewater along the river of So. Lamoro, Bgy. Pasadeña was observed,  
518 hence, recommended to conduct regular monitoring of coastal areas.
- 519 4. No negative changes observed in photo documentation sites.  
520

521 Ms. Rongavilla suggested to include on the report the proposed new monitoring sites for  
522 the approval of BMB.  
523

524 Mr. Jose Alferez recommended and motioned a resolution to have a coral rehabilitation in  
525 affected areas, especially in diving sites. It was seconded by Mr. Dominador Peñaranda.  
526

527 Mr. Jonathan Lualhati added that aside from coral bleaching, diving sites was also damaged  
528 due to anchorage. He recommended to install more mooring buoys because some installed buoys  
529 was cut-off.  
530

531 Hon. Cabras added that aside from installation, there must be an enforcer on the area.  
532

533 It was noted by the Secretariat.  
534

## 535 **7. Presentation of Integrated Protected Area Fund (IPAF) Work and Financial 536 Plan (WFP) 2023**

537 ENTMRPA Planning Officer Ms. Lanie Jane Rey presented the Integrated Protected Area  
538 Fund (IPAF) Work and Financial Plan (WFP) 2023.  
539

540 Hon. Antonio Cabras, Jr. reacted that the proposed WFP cost million which is  
541 unfavorable to them as members and he reminded their honorarium. They must be compensated  
542 on their travel expenses. He also suggested to let them review the WFP prior to approval.  
543

544 PASu Suza answered that almost 90% of the budget proposed was intended for the salary  
545 of Job Orders hired for protecting PA. She further cited the presentation of Ms. Rongavilla that  
546 members of the PAMB shall serve without compensation, except for the actual and necessary  
547 traveling and subsistence expenses incurred in the performance of duties but it can be reimbursed.  
548 It was already supported by a resolution last year but the LGU is requiring appointment paper for  
549 processing the claim.  
550

551 Ms. Faith Bangalisan also added that honorarium was already adopted by the Sangguniang  
552 Bayan with resolution but the LGU accountant requires appointment from the Secretary.  
553



556 It was also explained that Barangay Chairpersons are ex-officio members.

557  
558 Ms. Ubani added that DILG has instruction regarding this matter and the problem is with  
559 the accounting.

560  
561 The presiding officer suggested to have a meeting with accountant.

562  
563 Hon. Alan Tanaleon mentioned their resolution requesting 20% from 75% of IPAF.

564  
565 PASu Suza answered that it was already settled last year. Barangay Chairpersons were  
566 properly informed that they must submit proposals. In terms of enforcement and protection, it was  
567 also agreed that there will be two (2) Forest Protection Officer (FPO's) allocated in each barangays,  
568 charged to IPAF on their share. Some barangays did not submit proposals and FPOs. Hence, it was  
569 proposed to have one (1) FPO per barangay for 2023.

570  
571 Hon. Tanaleon sought to provide them a figure of 20% not enforcement.

572  
573 Ms. Rongavilla suggested to orient the Barangay Chairperson on Section 16. of ENIPAS.  
574 She further informed the Board that IPAF is solely use for protection, maintenance administration  
575 and management of protected area. The requested 20% was not mentioned in the law. It was not  
576 allowed to let them have the 20% because it is being checked by the Regional Office to avoid  
577 double funding or duplication of activities funded by the General Appropriations Act (GAA). It  
578 was the reason why they suggested to submit proposals and the PAMO will work on the budget  
579 depending on the current fund we have and the necessity of barangay and it must be related to  
580 protection and conservation of protected area.

581  
582 Hon. Tanaleon answered that they are expecting a response letter regarding this matter.

583  
584 Hon. Antonio Cabelas, Jr. motioned to defer the approval of the said proposal and provide  
585 copies to the members for their review. It was seconded by Mr. Dominador Peñaranda.

586  
587 PASu Suza explained the implications that the deferment of the approval of ENTMRPA-  
588 PAMO WFP will cause delay on its approval. Thus will consequently affect hiring of staff next  
589 year.

590  
591 Hon. Tanaleon insisted that we do not have a quorum.

592  
593 Ms. Ubani commented that next meeting, members who skipped the meeting must inform  
594 the body and commit that whatever the decision of the Board, they are okay with it.

595  
596 Ms. Rongavilla added that it can be added on the policy.

597  
598 The barangay chairpersons requested to include their proposal on the WFP. The PAMO  
599 will assist the barangays on their proposal, which must be related to conservation a protection  
600 activity.

601  
602 On motion of Hon. Ricky Ballena, it was agreed that there will be a meeting on October  
603 25, 2022. The deadline of proposal submission will be on October 21, 2022.

## 604 605 **8. Proposed Bulalacao Watershed Characterization ENF**

606  
607 Mr. Eric Lopez presented the proposed Bulalacao Watershed Characterization of El Nido  
608 Foundation (ENF) in Brgy. Pasadeña for submission to Forest Foundation Philippines, Inc.

609  
610 The said project will be called Watershed Assessment Towards El Nido's Resilience and  
611 Development – I (WATEReD I)

612  
613 The following are the objectives of proposal.

- 614  
615 1. Conduct watershed characterization and vulnerability assessment  
616 2. Partnership for sustainable watershed management and capacity building among  
617 stakeholders for improved forest governance



- 618 3. Multi-stakeholder advocacy strategy on forest and watershed protection, management  
619 and conservation  
620

621 In partnership with the Kalampinay Village Community, Barangay Pasadeña, LGU-El  
622 Nido, PAMB-PAMO and PCSD.  
623

624 Hon. Antonio Cabras, Jr. motioned for the approval of the proposed Bulalacao  
625 Watershed Characterization of El Nido Foundation (ENF), duly seconded by Hon. Ricky Ballena.  
626

627 The presiding officer informed that due to lack of quorum, it was not endorsed subject for  
628 presentation on next enbanc meeting.  
629

630 **9. ENTMRPA Anniversary celebration program;**  
631

632 Information Officer Aljen Becera informed the Board that PAMO will conduct series of  
633 activity such as Coastal Clean-up with stakeholders, Information and Education Campaign (IEC)  
634 with the students of El Nido Central Elementary School and Culminating ceremony with  
635 motorcade as part of 24<sup>th</sup> ENTMRPA anniversary celebration for this year.  
636

637 She also presented the program for the said event and invited the members to join the  
638 celebration.  
639

640 **VII. Other Matters**  
641

642 **1. Barangay Resolution No.14, Series of 2022 Requesting from the Protected**  
643 **Area Management Office (PAMB) to Allow or Give Opportunity to the**  
644 **Residents of Bebeladan to Conduct or Engage in Selling of Food Items**  
645 **(Ambulant Vendors) in the Islands and Beaches within the Jurisdiction of this**  
646 **Barangay**  
647

648 Hon. Antonio Cabras, Jr. raised his concern on the implementation of Resolution  
649 prohibiting the ambulant vendors in Islands. He explained that the affected vendors were from his  
650 community. He further emphasized that it was their only livelihood after pandemic, he pleaded to  
651 let them continue selling in islands.  
652

653 Hon. Rodante Reynoso added that we cannot implement such resolution, it should be an  
654 ordinance and it was approved long time ago.  
655

656 PASu Suza answered that the PAMO served letter to the vendors. She also emphasized  
657 that since 2020, the PAMO did not strictly implemented the PAMB Resolution No. 2018-012 in  
658 consideration with their requests but in recently meeting with CENRO, it was tackled and PAMO  
659 was tasked to take action on this matter. She further added that the PAMO was just implementing  
660 the resolution passed/created by the PAMB.  
661

662 The Board agreed to refer this matter to Conflict Resolutions Committee (CRC).  
663

664 **2. A Resolution Adopting the Guidelines for The Accreditation of Tour**  
665 **Operators, Boat Operators, Dive Shops and Tour Guides Operating within**  
666 **El Nido-Taytay Managed Resource Protected Area (ENTMRPA), El Nido,**  
667 **Palawan**  
668

669 Ms. Faith D. Bangalisan presented the Resolution No. 2019-078, A Resolution Adopting  
670 the Guidelines for The Accreditation of Tour Operators, Boat Operators, Dive Shops and Tour  
671 Guides Operating within El Nido-Taytay Managed Resource Protected Area (ENTMRPA), El  
672 Nido, Palawan.  
673

674 Hon. Reynoso reiterated his comments on the previous agenda. He suggested to create  
675 ordinance instead of resolution.  
676

677 Ms. Rongavilla answered that in PAMB, all decision must be documented as PAMB  
678 resolution. The management body of PAMB is different with LGU. The PAMB solely is a

legislative body to create policy itself. All operation within PA are also good as approved supported by a resolution as per Technical Bulletin of PAMB Operation. She further suggested to include on the Manual of Operation the effectivity of the approved resolution and re-visit the resolution to review if some provisions are still applicable on current situation.

On motion of Hon. Cabras, Jr. and was seconded by Hon. Allan Tanaleon, it was agreed to re-visit the said resolution for further amendments.

VIII. PASu Updates

APASu Casel presented the target activities accomplished by the PAMO pertaining to General Appropriations Act (GAA), IPAF and other activities.

1. Committee on Project Development





**WHEREAS**, during the PAMB en banc meeting, Ms. Michaela Rongavilla presented the comments from the Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB) regarding the PAMB Resolution No. 029 series of 2020 dated November 10, 2020 entitled "A Resolution earnestly requesting the Regional to lift the Moratorium on the Issuance of all the Permits for the construction of new building and any Improvements on Existing structures relative to the Implementation of rehabilitation program in the municipality of El Nido, Palawan" for lifting of moratorium within the municipality of El Nido;

**WHEREAS**, the BMB recommendation on their memorandum for the Secretary dated February 21, 2022 to continue imposition of the moratorium for the issuance of all permits for the construction of new buildings and any improvements on existing structures in El Nido until the concerned LGU, PA Management Office and ENTMRPA Management Board have complied and/or acted on the following measures;

1. For the PAMO and PAMB to update the PAMP including the management zones based on the result of the carrying capacity study and in consideration of the following in the designation of the Strict Protection Zone (SPZ)
2. The PAMB and PAMO to translate the carrying capacity study recommendations into various management strategies through updated PA Management Plan to be adopted by the PAMB through a Resolution;



3. For the PAMB, PAMO and concerned LGU to rehabilitate areas susceptible to erosion;
4. For the PAMO to coordinate with EMB for the establishment of permanent water quality monitoring stations;
5. For the PAMB in collaboration with the Local Government Unit of El Nido to impose measures addressing the various issues on water quality and land uses;
6. For the DENR Regional Office and PAMB to monitor the implementation of the above-mentioned measures and submit a quarterly report to this Office through BMB

**WHEREAS**, the special committee shall be composed of the following;

1. Local Government Unit (LGU);
2. Protected Area Management Board (PAMB);
3. Protected Area Management Office (PAMO);
4. Researchers;

**NOW THEREFORE**, on motion of Mr. Jose Alferez and duly seconded by Mr. Dominador Peñaranda Jr.; to recommend the coral rehabilitation in affected area within Biodiversity Monitoring System (BMS) site in ENTMRPA.
