

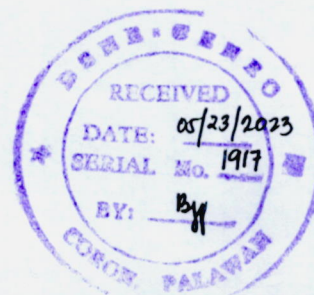



**ACTIVITY REPORT ON THE CONDUCTED CAPACITY BUILDING FOR
COASTAL AND MARINE RESOURCE ASSESSMENT UNDER GREEN ECONOMY
MODEL (GEM) CORON, PALAWAN**

May 10-12, 2023

Coron Westown Resort, Poblacion 6, Coron, Palawan

BACKGROUND

A “green economy” refers to a low-carbon, resource-efficient, and socially-inclusive economic system that substantially reduces environmental risks and ecological scarcity. One of the main tools in realizing the transition toward a green economy is the adoption of a Green Economy Model (GEM), which, according to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), is “a powerful tool that establishes a relationship between policy targets and relevant economic, environmental, and social dimensions”.

GEM is in reference to the Republic Act 10771 otherwise known as The Philippine Green Jobs Act of 2016 which intends to promote the creation of green jobs granting incentives and appropriate funds therefore; and in view of the approval of Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2017-2022 anchored on *Ambisyon Natin 2040: Matatag, Maginhawa, at Panatag na Buhay*, and by virtue of DENR Administrative Order 2017-08 otherwise known as the “Guidelines in operationalizing the transition of the DENRs programs and projects into GEM that aims to transform its programs and projects into GEM to create viable community enterprise where households are the focal members and players in creating value-added environmental products and services; and accelerate the rehabilitation of degraded ecosystem and promote the protection of the environment through the creation of green jobs.

RATIONALE

Based on the result of the water quality regularly conducted by DENR-EMB, water quality in Coron Bay from 2011 to present is failed. This issue is significant environmental challenge facing in Coron, Palawan considering that Coron is a worldwide known tourist destination. To address this, the conduct of assessment in Coastal and Marine area in and adjacent to Coron Bay is identified under GEM which aims to monitor the trend and status of marine ecosystem that could be used in calibrating appropriate responses and promotes sustainability of ecosystem likewise to improve the coastal and marine resource management in the area.

In order to capacitate the technical personnel of CENRO Coron for the implementation of Green Economy Model and programs/projects in Coron, Palawan and in support to future target activities under Coastal and Marine Ecosystem Management Program (CMEMP) the Capacity Building for Coastal and Marine Resources Assessment was conducted.

HIGHLIGHT OF ACTIVITY

Venue and Schedule: May 10-12, 2023 at Coron Westown Resort and Cabu Beach, Coron, Palawan

Objective: This activity aims to capacitate technical staff of DENR CENRO Coron in coastal and marine assessment

The program was conducted through a hybrid format consisting of both a zoom session and a face-to-face setup. ECOMS II, Mark Glenn Managdag acknowledged all the participants, followed by a short message from DMO IV Edwin I. Cac before the proper training began.

On the first day of training, the following topics/lecture were discussed by each speaker:

1. Mangrove Assessment – Karl Aries Sumandal
2. Seagrass Assessment- Lucila Garagara — Candeleja
3. Fish Visual Census- Jo Annie Corvera
4. Coral Assessment and Coral Point Count in Excel (CPCe) application- Krizia Meryl Ecube

All methods discussed was in accordance to relevant DENR BMB Technical Bulletin No. 2019-04 "Technical Guide on Biodiversity and Assessment Monitoring System for Coastal and Marine Ecosystems (BAMS)" complementary to DENR BMB Technical Bulletin No. 2017-05 or the "Guidelines on the Coastal and Marine Ecosystems". Brief information about mangrove, seagrass, corals and reef fishes were also discussed in the training. Moreover, all questions, queries and clarifications related to the topics were answered after the presentation.

Day 2 – May 11, 2023. To put all the knowledge gained from the first day of discussion into practice, all participants and resource speaker conducted actual assessment of mangroves, seagrass, corals, and reef fishes at Cabu Beach in Brgy Tagumpay, Coron, Palawan. The participants were split into two groups; one group was tasked to conduct mangroves and seagrass assessment, while the other group was tasked in assessment of the corals and fish. Each team performs the actual assessment process under the facilitator's guidance.

Day 3 – May 12, 2023. All data collected were encoded in Microsoft Office Application. Speakers in every ecosystem discussed the analysis of data using Excel. For the analysis of coral, CPCe Software was used. Each resource speakers have discussed the computation and analysis used in transcription and interpretation of data. (*also in accordance to DENR BMB TB 2019-04*)


Lecture on Technical Report Writing

Ms. Lucila Garagara-Candeleja discussed about technical writing to enhance the report writing skills of participants, a group activity regarding the topic was conducted afterwards where each group have to write a memorandum type of document from a given situation/scenario.

An open forum where participants were asked to share their takeaway in the topics that were discussed from the three days seminar were also conducted. At the end of the training, an official closing ceremony was done and each participant have received a certificate for completing the training. Finally, all participants gained knowledge about the mangrove, seagrass and coral assessment and also the fish visual census and understood how to conduct the assessment particularly in the field. This mandates are being implemented in Calamianes Group of Islands (CIG) through CENRO however implementation and enforcing of ENR laws remains a challenge given the geographic location of area responsibility, lacks of vehicle and boat for transportation and dearth number of enforcers, thus, collaboration with the local communities for the implementation of ENR laws is a need to address challenges/issues encounter in monitoring and enforcing laws for the protection and conservation of the natural resources. This was under Strategic approach of GEM, Strengthened enforcement of ENR Laws in Coron, Palawan.

HIGHLIGHTS OF ACTIVITY

Venue and Schedule: May 8-9, 2023 at EOC Conference Hall, LGU Coron, Poblacion 2, Coron, Palawan

Objective: This activity aims to strengthen the enforcement of ENR laws through collaboration with local communities through the formation or deputation of a local monitoring team and capacitate them through the provision of an ENR Laws seminar that could greatly contribute to the implementation of laws and policies for the protection and conservation of our environment and natural resources.

Day 1. On May 8, 2023, the GEM team provided a brief overview of the training workshop objectives. Enforcement plan were also drafted with inputs of locals to be used in the implementation and operation of LMT for Green Economy Model in Coron.



ACTIVITY REPORT ON THE OF ENFORCEMENT SKILLS TRAINING TO MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT TEAM OF CENRO CORON UNDER GREEN ECONOMY MODEL (GEM) CORON, PALAWAN

May 15-17, 2023

Coron Westown Resort and COSA Firing Range at Poblacion 6, Coron, Palawan

BACKGROUND

A “green economy” refers to a low-carbon, resource-efficient, and socially-inclusive economic system that substantially reduces environmental risks and ecological scarcity. One of the main tools in realizing the transition toward a green economy is the adoption of a Green Economy Model (GEM), which, according to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), is “a powerful tool that establishes a relationship between policy targets and relevant economic, environmental, and social dimensions”.

GEM is in reference to the Republic Act 10771 otherwise known as The Philippine Green Jobs Act of 2016 which intends to promote the creation of green jobs granting incentives and appropriate funds therefore; and in view of the approval of Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2017-2022 anchored on *Ambisyon Natin 2040: Matatag, Maginhawa, at Panatag na Buhay*, and by virtue of DENR Administrative Order 2017-08 otherwise known as the “Guidelines in operationalizing the transition of the DENRs programs and projects into GEM that aims to transform its programs and projects into GEM to create viable community enterprise where households are the focal members and players in creating value-added environmental products and services; and accelerate the rehabilitation of degraded ecosystem and promote the protection of the environment through the creation of green jobs.

RATIONALE

As one of the target activities under GEM, conduct of Enforcement Skills Training is one of the identified activities in support to the strategic approach for intensifying the implementation of ENR Laws within the area of jurisdiction.

HIGHLIGHTS OF ACTIVITY

Venue and Schedule: May 15-17, 2023 at Coron Westown Resort and COSA Firing Range, Poblacion 6, Coron, Palawan

Objective: This activity aims to capacitate CENRO Coron enforcement and monitoring Team through provision of enforcement skills training.

Day 1. On May 15, 2023- Ms. Marwin Padilla discussed about Disaster and Risk Reduction (DRR) which focuses specifically on the three key dimensions of disaster risk:

- Exposure to hazards
- Vulnerability and capacity
- Characteristics of each hazard

Speakers from Coron Municipal Police provided a lecture on first responders, basic defense and handcuffing techniques, and disarming using arnis. Also discussed here are the procedure of arrest, the importance of reading the Miranda Rights to the opponent, and the four handcuffing positions (standing, kneeling, prone, and wall-supported positions) demonstrated by the standing, kneeling, prone, and facing the wall positions.

After the lecture, PCPl Jethro Tull Castil and Patrolman Mark Jason David Miranda demonstrated handcuffing techniques and self-defense. Then participants were grouped and assigned different scenarios per group to perform different techniques.

Day 2. On May 16, 2023, guest speakers from the 2nd Special Operation Unit, PNP Maritime Group-Coron Maritime Special Boat Crew provided a lecture. Patrolman Herbert Dumawal discussed Rule 113 Arrest under the Revised Rule on Criminal Procedure dated December 1, 2000, while Patrolman Carlito Madeja Jr. conducted a lecture on gun safety and gun handling. He elaborated on the Four Cardinal Rules of Gun Safety:

1. Always treat all firearms as if they were loaded;
2. Never allow the muzzle of any firearm to point at anything you are not willing to destroy;
3. Never put your finger near the trigger until you are ready to fire. Do not depend on any mechanical device for safety!;
4. Always be sure of your target, and what is behind and in front of it.

Actual demonstrations of gun handling, assembling and disassembling were also done after the lecture.

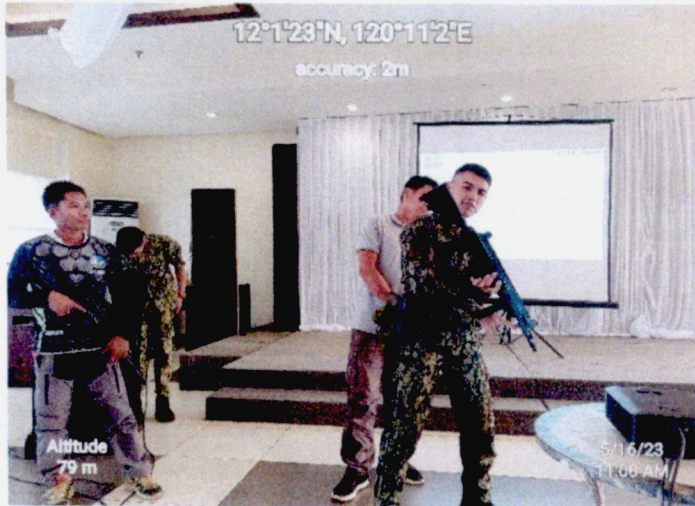
