

I. Opening of Program

The Provincial Multi-sectoral Forest Protection Committee (PMFPC) meeting formally started with a prayer followed by singing of the National Anthem.

Forester I Don Gibson D. Mercado did the roll call of the attendees of 1st PMFPC meeting and afterward the OIC PENRO formally take over the floor and presided the meeting.

II. Meeting Proper:

OIC PENRO Imelda M. Diaz, welcomed the participants and presented the proposed agenda of the PMFPC meeting, as follows:

- 1. Reading of previous minutes
- 2. Presentation of Targets of DENR for Law Enforcement

3. Plans and Programs of PMFPC; and
4. Other matters

PMFPC member Elizabeth E. Manggol of MASEC moved for the approval of agenda, seconded by Lester Rich R. Martin of Provincial Information Officer.

OIC PENRO Diaz called on Forester I Don Gibson D. Mercado to present the previous minutes of the 6th PMFPC meeting.

The body were asked if there are any comments/clarification and correction of names in the previous minutes.

Forester Mercado, presented the Targets of DENR PENRO Marinduque for Law Enforcement. Likewise, he also discussed the plans and programs of PMFPC for 2023. Afterwards, he asked for any queries or clarifications about the topic.

PENRO Diaz raised the issue regarding illegal trade and collection of butterfly particularly in Brgy. Bagtingon, Buenavista, Marinduque. She said that it need urgent action of monitoring and surveillance of all illegal transport of butterfly.

Mr. Bernardo Lacerna, REACT representative asked PENRO Diaz regarding the allegedly on going project in Barangay Ulong, Mogpog, Marinduque. According to Mr. Lacerna, the area was occupied by illegal settlers near the foreshore area. He asked, if DENR is aware regarding the said activity.

PENRO Diaz, asked the representative of DPWH if they have existing project in the said area.

Ms. Yohanna Mae M. del Mundo, representative of DPWH answered that they have no project in the area specified by Mr. Lacerna.

Furthermore, Mr. Lacerna, asked about the requirements for establishing infrastructure in the foreshore area.

Forester Mercado answered that Foreshore Lease Agreement is needed.

Romeo M. Davalos, Jr. representative of Armed Forces of the Philippines Reserved Command, suggested that members of PMFPC will conduct actual ground verification regarding on the alleged project in the reclaimed area situated in Barangay Ulong, Mogpog, Marinduque.

Ms. Elizabeth Manggol, representative of MACEC shared that they have a project bioremediation with an area of 2.0 hectares in Barangay Capayang, Mogpog, Marinduque in partnership with Local Government Unit of Mogpog, Marinduque and DOST intended to rehabilitate the mine-out areas of Consolidated Mines, Inc. (CMI).

PENRO Diaz, open up the issues regarding beema bamboo or other exotic species and stated that importing these species requires clearance from the DENR Secretary and other appropriate permit depending on the purpose such as for scientific research purposes.

Engr. Romeo M. Davalos Jr., asked regarding the deputation/tranings for WEO. He said that he was invited as a participant to a one-month training on special course of environmental law however, the basic requirements is physically fit and mentally sound and he understand that based on the requirements is most likely in military wherein the participants are PNP, and military force.

PENRO Diaz, clearly said that it is only the basic requirements and not necessary military participants.

Engr. Davalos Jr., suggested to hire additional Job Orders for additional patrollers to conduct patrolling and monitoring in our protected areas and timberland areas to prevent illegal activities.

PENRO Diaz, said that PENRO have hired Forest Protection Officers (FPO) however, the Local Government and DENR should have partnership in the protection and conservation of natural resources. They shared

responsibility in protecting and managing our natural resources.

PLTCOL Elmer Manalo, representative of Marinduque Police Office intensified their Information Campaign with regards to forest protection. He also emphasized the importance of Deputation Order in their level of work specifically during filing of cases in court. If they have no deputation order, the case is not valid and it is being dismissed by the court.

PENRO Diaz, asked if PNP can act immediately if ever there is an incident of apprehension/abandoned forest products even if they are not deputized.

PLTCOL Manalo, explained to the body that they need proper coordination and assistance regarding the technicality with the DENR during the apprehension activities or any illegal activities within the province of Marinduque.

PENRO Diaz, emphasized that deputation of PNP is important especially during the filing of cases, but, PNP have an authority to apprehend with or without deputation.

PENRO Diaz, asked about other agencies such as Barangays and other civilian group.

Forester Mercado, explained that all government enforcers such as PNP, NBI need not to be deputized based on the guidelines. However, we deputized them to be formal and based on the guidelines of deputation, all government enforcer have inherent capacity to implement environmental law same as LGU but they need technical assistance from the DENR during filing of cases.

PENRO Diaz, emphasized that PENRO Marinduque will accommodate individuals willing to be deputized as long as they will submit complete requirements.

Mr. Romeo A. Mataac Jr., representative of Philippine Information Agency suggested to have official group chat of PMFPC of Marinduque for dissemination of announcement and information regarding the activity and special events of DENR.

Ms. Monggol, said that they are actively campaigning the environmental laws and she asked if there are additional IEC materials that would help to disseminate information to the public.

PENRO Diaz, said that this Office will provide IEC materials.

Mr. Anthony de la Peña., representative of butterfly permittee association asked for assistance regarding the illegal trade and collection of butterfly without Wildlife Farm Permit (WFP).

Ms. Del Mundo, representative of DPWH asked about the process and releasing of cutting permit.

PENRO Diaz, answered that the requirements must be completed before submitting to this Office to avoid delay in the approval and release of permit.


Mr. Mark Dennis Cortez, representative of Department of Trade Provincial Industry (DTI) said that MSC has begun planting beema bamboo in Marinduque. As a result of the activity, the Governor agreed the planting of beema bamboo because of its good quality specially and its economic value.

PENRO Diaz has no information regarding the continuous planting of beema bamboo in Marinduque because DENR did not allow exotic species to be planted or introduced in our NGP area. Thus, she said that it needs clearance from the DENR Secretary if they want to propagate the said species.

III. Closing Remark:


Having no more matter to be discussed, the Presiding Officer adjourned the meeting at exactly 12:41 in the afternoon.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-001

RESOLUTION ADOPTING AGREEMENTS MADE AS STIPULATED IN THE MINUTES OF THE PROVINCIAL MULTI-SECTORAL FOREST PROTECTION COMMITTEE (PMFPC) HELD ON MAY 03, 2023 AT PENR OFFICE FUNCTION HALL, BOAC, MARINDUQUE

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Executive Order No. 192, states that the DENR is responsible for the conservation, management, and development of the country's environment and natural resources, as well as their proper use, and shall ensure the equitable sharing of benefits derived therefrom for the welfare of the present and future generations of Filipinos;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Executive Order No. 23, dated February 01, 2011, created the Anti-Illegal Logging Task Force composed of DENR, DILG, DND, PNP, AFP, which is mandated to take the lead in the anti-illegal logging campaign and ensure the implementation of this Executive Order under the supervision of the DENR. It shall also assist the DENR in the enforcement of forests and environmental laws; and

WHEREAS, the Provincial Multi-Sectoral Forest Protection Committee have existing Memorandum of Agreement dated August 05, 2021 and it states that the government agencies, non-government organization, private sectors and other concerned entities hereby agree to render mutual collaboration and cooperation for protection, conservation, sustainable utilization of the natural resources, including social justice and general welfare of the Filipinos.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby **RESOLVED** to adopt and implement the following agreements:

1. To address the issue, concern or problems that was raised during the PMFPC meeting relative to the ongoing project in the reclamation area in Sitio Ulong, Barangay Capayang, Mogpog, a composite team is hereby created to investigate on the matter to be composed of the following:

Members : PNP, PIA, PPA, AFRESCOM, MARITIME, DPWH,
DILG, REACT, MACEC

2. To create an official Group Chat of PMFPC to facilitate communication of all members and in support to the existing Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Campaign Committee.
