

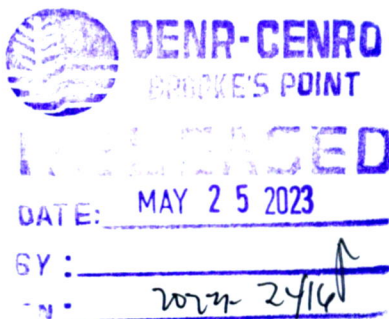

The POs awarded with CBFMAs is active with different activities implemented within their tenured area. The PCMNMP in Sofronio Española continuously conducted monitoring and forest protection works within 1,481.25 hectares area. The implementation of (*Agroforestry Narra, Rubber and Cacao intercropped with Banana*) (Saba) CARP project is continuously managed and protected. Meetings and assemblies were assisted and attended by CENRO personnel.

Furthermore, this office is continuously providing technical assistance to strengthen the capabilities of the People's Organization in the development, protection and management of their tenured areas.

COMMUNITY BASED FOREST MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT (CBFMA)

The Punang Christian Muslim Native Multi-Purpose Cooperative (PCMN-MPC) was awarded with CBFM Agreement No. RIV-PAL-CBFMA-2000-17 on December 21, 2000 covering a total of 1,481.25 hectares of forest land located in Barangay Punang Sofronio Española, Palawan. The cooperative was registered with Cooperative Development Authority with registration No. 9520-04008171 registered on January 26, 2000. Currently it has total of 165 members/beneficiaries.

The Punang Christian Muslim Native Multi-Purpose Cooperative (PCMNMPC) is one of the partner of DENR in the implementation of the CBFM-CARP project Agro-forestry (Narra, Rubber and Cacao) Intercropped with Banana (Saba) of 20 hectares.

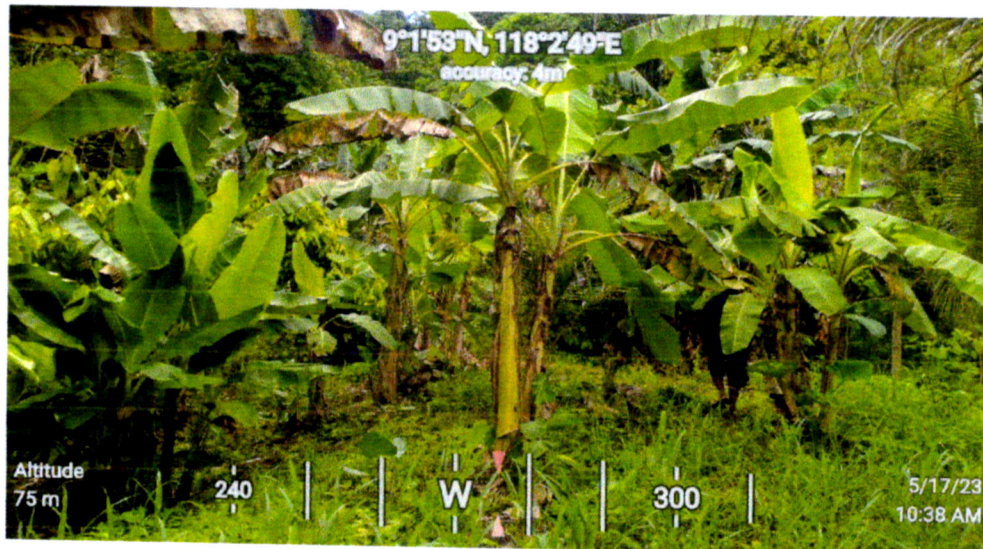
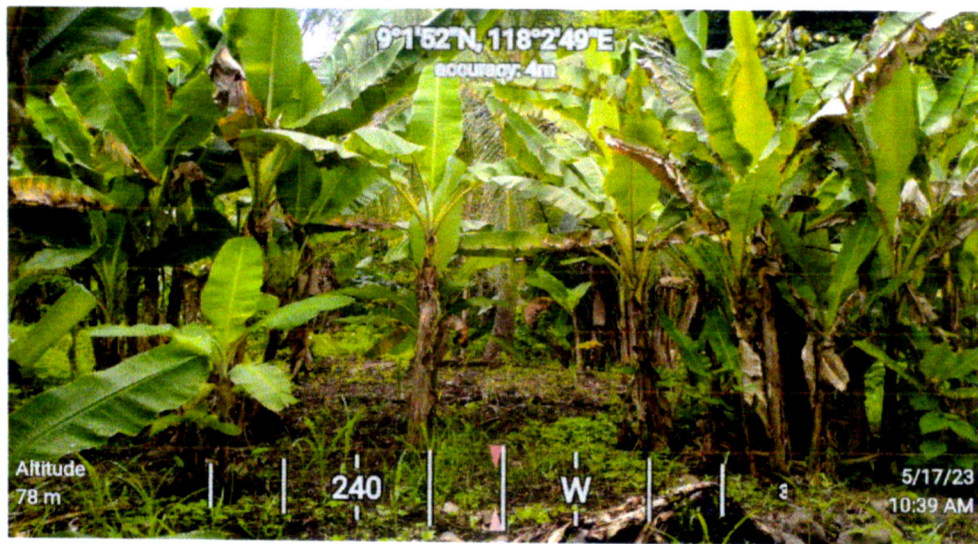


Figure 2. Banana Plantation within CBFM area

Currently, the cooperative still ventures in palm oil plantation. It was established the areas occupied by CBFM members inside of the CBFM area which was awarded with CLOA. The plantation was solely managed by the cooperative.

Aside from the above projects of the PO, the following activities were also undertaken to wit:

- Regular foot patrol within the tenured area including adjacent timberland areas to prevent and detect illegal activities
- Regular meeting conducted by the PO to immediate resolved issues and concerns.
- Coordinated with other funding agencies/institutions for livelihood projects.
- Development/maintenance of the individual tenured areas by planting of forest trees, fruit trees and cash crops as source of livelihood
- The DENR-CENRO is continuous providing technical assistance and monitoring of the projects

Last May 17, 2023, the monitoring was conducted by CDS-CBFM Unit, MES personnel and Deputy CENRO, whereas, the following are the observation, to wit:

1. Continuous maintenance and protection of established CBFM-CARP project within the tenured area
2. The carabao purchased by the PO is continuously being cared and protected under the CARP project. Said Carabao is also being used during the hauling of oil palm
3. A large portion of the CBFM area was awarded with CLOA
4. Mining road within the portion of CBFM area
5. Development/maintenance of the individual tenured areas by planting of forest trees, fruit trees and cash crops as source of livelihood
6. Oil Palm plantation within the CBFM area
7. Potential quarry within the river at CBFM area

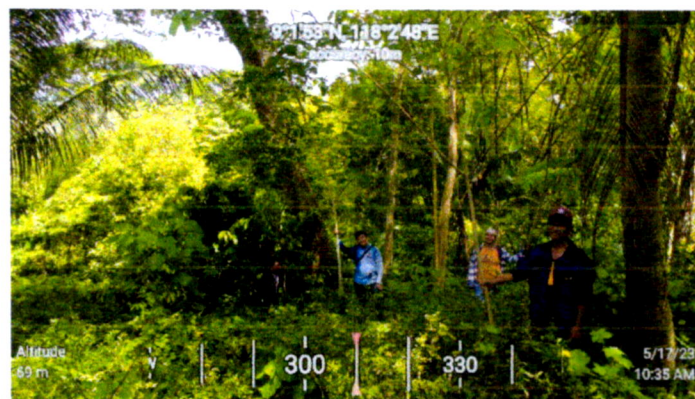


Figure 6. Photos taken during the conduct monitoring of CBFM area

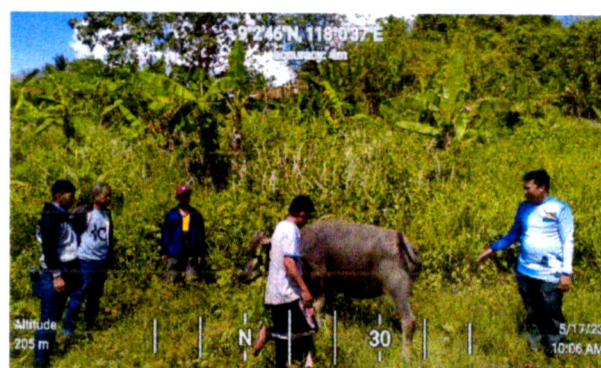



Figure 7. Photo showing CENRO personnel taken during the monitoring of Carabao under the CARP
