

### AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE PHASE-OUT OF SINGLE - USE PLASTICS IN APO REEF NATURAL PARK.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Protected Area Management Board for Apo Reef Natural Park, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro.

### ARTICLE I POLICY AND APPLICATION

**Section 1. Short Title.** This Administrative Order shall be known as the "SINGLE-USE PLASTICS PHASE-OUT IN APO REEF NATURAL PARK."

HON. WALTER B. MARQUEZ Municipal Mayor, LGU Sablayan Ex- Officio Member **Section 2. Declaration of Policy.** It is hereby declared the policy of the Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) of Apo Reef Natural Park to conserve, protect, and maintain the natural, biological, and physical diversities of the environment to ensure the perpetual existence of all native plants and animals for the benefit of present and future generations.

AGUSTIN C. MENDOZA Regional Director, NEDA Member With the emerging concern regarding the persistent negative impacts of single use plastics on the health of marine ecosystems and wildlife resources, it is the policy of the PAMB of Apo Reef Natural Park to provide responsive policies to curb the use and disposal of single-use plastics and encourage marine plastic pollution management programs, plans and activities that will eradicate the use of single use plastics and other non-environmentally acceptable products.

### ALGENE EDWARD M. FRANCISCO Representative- PUP, Sablayan Campus Member

Section 3. Scope. The provisions of this Administrative Order shall be enforced within the area and territorial jurisdiction of the Apo Reef Natural Park as defined under Republic Act 11038, and within other area which may be established as a part thereof, pursuant to any amendment of the said Act. Specifically, this Administrative Order shall apply to all individuals, including owners and operators of all establishments that engage in business, tourism, research, and other purposes.

**Section 4. Definition of Terms.** As used in the Administrative Order, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

- (a) <u>CLAMSHELL FOOD CONTAINER</u> refers to any food container with two pieces of packaging material that are hinged on one side. This is often used for serving or transporting prepared and ready-to-consume food;
- (b) <u>COTTON BUD</u> refers to an item consisting of a plastic rod and round pieces of cotton at both ends;
- (c) <u>DOY / TETRA PACK</u> refers to plastic packaging designed to stand upright and typically used for low-volume, ready-to-drink beverages;

CONSERVATION YEAR 2023 (d) PRODUCE BAG refers to any bag without handles used for carrying and transporting fruits, vegetables, raw meats and seafood, and other food items or merchandise. It is locally known as *plastic labo*;

(e) **SINGLET BAG** refers to any bag with handles used for carrying and transporting fruits, vegetables, raw meats and seafood, and other food items or merchandise. It is locally known as sando bag;

- (f) **SINGLE-USE PLASTICS** refer to disposable items made wholly or partly of plastic which are commonly used for packaging and include items intended to be used only once before they are thrown away or recycled;
- (g) **STIRRER** refers to any object or device used to mix beverages like coffee;

- (h) STRAW refers to any thin tube that is used to consume a beverage more conveniently; and,
- **WET WIPES** refer to small and damp pieces of paper or fabric used for cleaning or disinfecting

### ARTICLE II PROHIBITION AND PENAL PROVISIONS

Section 5. Prohibited Acts. It shall be unlawful for any individual or commercial and business establishments engaged in business, tourism, research, and other purposes to use, sell, convey, or distribute any of the following singleuse plastics and products packaged thereof:

(a) Lightweight plastic singlet bags and produce bags;

- (b) Disposable cutlery, straws, stirrers, cups, bowls, flat plates, cling wrap and clamshell food containers:
- (c) Uncarbonated, unflavored drinking water in single-use containers less than 7 liters and other carbonated and/or flavored beverages in single-use containers less than 1.5 liters;
- (d) Ready-to-drink beverages in doy / tetra packs;
- (e) Balloons and balloon sticks with cups;
- (f) Plastic-stemmed cotton buds excluding nasopharyngeal swabs for viral specimen collection; and,
- (g) Plastic-based wet wipes excluding first aid wipes and towelettes.

The ban for the use and conveyance of plastic straws shall not be applicable to disabled persons, as defined under Republic Act Nø. 7277.

**Section 6. Penalties.** Violation of the above shall be punished by the following administrative penalty:

**First Offense** 

Fine of Php1,000,00, Oral and written

warnings

**Second Offense** 

Fine of Php10,000.00

**Third Offense** 

Fine of Php30,000.00

**Fourth and subsequent offense** – Ban from entering Apo Reef Natural

Park for at least 1 year

### **ARTICLE III** OTHER PROVISIONS

Section 7. Monitoring and Public Awareness Campaigns. To ensure the effective implementation and compliance of this Order, the Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) shall ensure the conduct of monitoring and public awareness campaigns.

Section 8. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Administrative Order or application of such provision to any person or circumstances is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of the Order of the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

Section 9. Repealing Clause. All issuances, rules and regulations, or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
