### ACTIVITY REPORT ON 2nd QUARTER SABLAYAN-CALINTAAN MARINE PROTECTED AREA (SaCa MPAN) EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

### I. BACKGROUND

Marine Protected Area Network (MPAN) is an aggregation of individual MPAs or reserves operating collectively and synergistically at various spatial scales, designed to meet objectives based on ecological, social, informational, and administrative considerations that a single reserve cannot achieve alone, while also linking people and institutions involved in a harmonized and holistic initiative to facilitate learning and coordination in planning and administration.

Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) have been employed as an important coastal resource management tool in the Philippines to respond to the growing threats to fishery production and marine biodiversity (Aliño et al. 2002). A growing number of empirical studies have shown the potential benefits of MPAs to fisheries have been done (e.g. Alcala and Russ 1990, Roberts et al. 2001, May et al. 2002, Abesamis et al. 2006). During the last few decades, the potential value of MPAs to protect rare and threatened species is slowing being recognized and applied (e.g. establishment of dugong sanctuaries) in the country.

The Marine Protected Areas Networking (MPAN) Memorandum of Agreement between the DENR MIMAROPA Region, Provincial Government of Occidental Mindoro and with the municipalities of Sablayan and Calintaan was agreed to form a cluster and work together within their common coastal ecosystem to maximize resources and the benefits that will be gained from the collaboration with the assistance of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

### a. MPAN Executive Committee Meeting

The SaCa MPAN Executive Committee in facilitation of CENRO Sablayan and PENRO, conducted the second quarter meeting at Camalig Restaurant, Sablayan, Occidental Mindoro on June 16, 2023.

The meeting started at 10:30 in the morning with a prayer followed by the singing of the National anthem thru an AVP. Welcome address was given by Hon. Mayor Walter B. Marquez of LGU Sablayan followed by words of encouragement from Hon. Vice Mayor George I. Oreiro of LGU Calintaan. Roll call, proof of quorum, presentation and approval of the provisional agenda were facilitated by ECOMS II Pedro A. Marmol from CENRO Sablayan.

The highlights of the said activity were presented by ECOMS I Herold S. Castro. The topics, issues, and concerns discussed are listed hereunder:

### 1. Approval of the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The minutes of the previous meeting which was conducted last March 28, 2023 was read by the secretariat. Upon reading and incorporating the agreed on with some corrections, the minutes of the previous meeting was approved through the motion of Hon. Oreiro and seconded by Hon. Councilor Reynaldo P. Marquez suggested the approval of the Manual of Operations since the committee may create amendments for any changes or additions. The Manual of Operations was unanimously approved through the motion of Hon. Oreiro and seconded by Hon. Dormido.

### 3. Adoption of Strategic Plan



 As a Secretariat of the MPAN, the DENR CENRO Sablayan thru Mr. Castro asked the Executive Committee to nominate among them who Officer of the First Quarter Executive Committee meeting.

Through the nomination of Hon. Mr. Paglicawan, and as most of the ExeCom members agreed, Mr. Ramos was elected to be the presiding officer.

### 3. Reading, Corrections and Approval of Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The ExeCom members were given a copy of minutes of the previous meeting conducted last December 7, 2022 as their reference, subjected for correction and approval.

The meeting started with the Chair asking if there are any additions of topics to be discussed, hearing none it was followed by the approval of minutes of the previous meeting, read and presented by Mr. Castro.

For I Attendance, Mr. Ramos added the correction of his name from John Paul C. Ramos to John Paul Aristotle C. Ramos, and to change PPDO to PPDC. Ms. Amurao added to change the represented office of Ms. Marivic U. Macalalad from SB Committee on Environment LGU-Calintaan to MPDO, LGU-Calintaan

Upon reading with some corrections, the minutes of the previous meeting was approved through the motion of Hon. Paglicawan and seconded by Hon. Dormido

### 4. Manual of Operations

The reading of draft Manual of Operations for SaCa MPAN was presented by Mr. Castro through a projector; the body may interrupt if there are any corrections, comments or suggestions.

- For 2.1 Scope of Application, Mr. Garingalo asked for the clarification of the MPAs within or under the MPAN, Mr.Ormega recommends the inclusion of possible MPAs within the Sablayan and Calintaan, Mr.Paglicawan answered that the established MPAs should only be included, Mr. Castro suggested that the MPAs established as of December 2022 should be included which was agreed by the body.
- For 2.2 Declaration of Policy, Mr. Garingalo asked for the clarification of the term adopt and suggested the use of the term adopts and declares, Mr. Ormega also suggested the use of the term adopt and embrace, the body decided and approved to use the term adopt and declares.
- For 2.3 Guiding Principles, Mr. Ormega suggested including the Municipal Agriculture Office as one of the members of the SaCa-MPAN Executive Committee. Mr. Castro responds that it is good and possible with a resolution from the SaCa-MPAN members. For no. 11 Political Neutrality Mr. Ormega suggested for the clarification of the term used unfair discrimination and suggested the removal of the word unfair that was approved by the body.

Mr. Ormega suggested the clarification of the composition when using the terms SaCa-MPAN members/board/execom members, with few discussions the body clarified and decided that the term SaCa-MPAN members refers to all of the members including the ExeCom and non-ExeCom members, and not to use the term SaCa-MPAN board since it somehow set confusion with the SaCa-MPAN ExeCom members.

Mr. Garingalo suggested the addition of Protection, Conservation, and Management on the SaCa-MPAN duties and responsibilities, with the pleasure of the body the inclusion was approved and will be written in bullet form. Hon. Paglicawan added the use of gender neutral terms for the MOP.

For 2.4 Definition of Terms, Mr. Garingalo suggested for the additional definition for the terms: mangrove ecosystem, reef fish and suggested for additional terms to define such as coral and reef.

For 4 SaCa MPAN, Executive Committee Members, Hon. Paglicawan suggested the removal SB Chair on environment since the SB is under the management of the Vice Mayor and to include MAO as an ExeCom Member for each municipality. Hon. Paglicawan also suggested for the Organizational structure be placed first before the Executive Committee, he also asked for the clarification of the power and function of the ExeCom, MPAN Manager, and Secretariat to the different Government Offices, NGOs, and private sectors, which are members of the SaCa-MPAN. Mr. Ramos suggested that there should only be one (1) MPAN manager, Hon. Paglicawan answered that there should be one (1) manager for each Municipality for juridical responsibilities or the Manager should be from the Provincial Office.

For 4.4 Terms of Office of SaCa-MPAN Executive Committee, Mr. Garingalo suggested that the terms of office of the MPAN Chair must align on their administrative terms on being the Municipal Mayors. Mr. Ormega suggested that each ExeCom Members should give the copies and explain the Manual Operations to their respected Chief ExeCutive and let them decide among them who shall be the Chairperson, Mr. Ormega also suggested for the alternating of terms for both the Mayors.

For 6 SaCa MPAN Conduct of Meetings, Mr. Garingalo also suggested for the clarification of the schedule of meetings since meetings usually depends on the availability of the ExeCom members, he also suggested the schedule of meetings be within the 2<sup>nd</sup> month of every quarter and not with specific day or week. Mr. Garingalo also requested for the presence of representatives from CENRO San Jose for the upcoming meetings on which the body requested and agreed. Hon. Paglicawan suggested for the conduct of special meeting for the finalization of MOP which is agreed by the body, the venue and schedule of the special meeting is to be finalize.

Ms. Amurao asked if it is ok or possible for the integration on the Municipal resolution for MPAs to the SaCa-MPAN, the body answered that it is ok and possible.

Mr. Ormega requested for the copy of the Manual of Operations for each ExeCom members for faster finalization.

Furthermore, the CENRO Sablayan coordinated and conducted orientation meetings with stakeholders from fisher folks sectors and members of Barangay, Sangguniang Panlalawigan, and Local Government Units (LGUs) of Paluan, Abra de Ilog, Lubang and Loca for the VIP-PASA. Key Informant Interviews (KII) was also accomplished with a total of nine hundred twenty four (924) respondents from the thirty one (31) identified Barangays of the above mentioned Municipalities with the assistance from the Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB) and PENRO Occidental Mindoro,. The Verde Island Passage falls to the Protected Area category of Protected Landscape and/or Seascape because of its salient features of harmonious interaction of human and nature due to its naturalness and socioeconomic importance. Thus, this area is recommended and proposed as Verde Island Passage Protected Seascape (VIPPS).

Please be informed that the Conservation and Development Section of CENRO Sablayan, conducted activities on Coastal and Marine Resources: Sablayan-Calintaan Marine Protected Areas Network (SaCa-MPAN) and Verde Island Passage Protected Area Suitability Assessment.

### A. Sablayan-Calintaan Marine Protected Areas Network (SaCa-MPAN)

The Marine Protected Areas Network (MPAN) Memorandum of Agreement between the DENR MIMAROPA Region, Provincial Government of Occidental Mindoro and the Municipalities of Sablayan and Calintaan agreed to form a cluster and work together within their common coastal ecosystem to maximize resources and the benefits that will be gained from the collaboration with the assistance of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources. The Adoption of The SaCa-MPAN Manual of Operations and Strategic Plan was approved during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter Executive Committee meeting conducted on June 16, 2023.

### B. Verde Island Passage Protected Area Suitability Assessment (VIP-PASA)

The Verde Island Passage is a strait that separates the islands of Luzon in the Philippines, connecting the South China Sea with the Tayabas Bay and the Sibuyan Sea beyond. Traditionally, the sea lane has been one of the busiest in the Philippines because it acts as a corridor from the Port of Manila to the Visayas and Mindanao in the south. A network of ferry routes cross the passage and connect the surrounding provinces of Batangas, Marinduque, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro and Romblon. The 1.14 million hectare passage is extremely rich in marine biodiversity and has been called "Center of the Center of Marine Shorefish Biodiversity" with various conservation groups and local government units pushing for its nomination as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The CENRO Sablayan, with help from the Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB) and PENRO Occidental Mindoro, organized a coordination and orientation meeting with stakeholders from fisherfolks, sectors and members of barangay, members of Sangguniang Panglalawigan, and Local Government Units (LGUs). The VIP- PASA Team completed the interview with a total of nine hundred twenty four (924) respondents from the thirty one (31) identified barangays of the municipalities of Occidental Mindoro encompassing the Verde Island Passage.

The Verde Island Passage has great benefits in the livelihood and sustainable life support thru ecosystem services to the stakeholders. As the result of the PASA activities and analysis, the Verde Island Passage falls to the Protected Area category of Protected Landscape and/or Seascape because of its salient features of harmonious interaction of human and nature due to its naturalness and socio-economic importance, thus recommended and proposed the study site as Verde Island Passage Protected Seascape (VIPPS).
