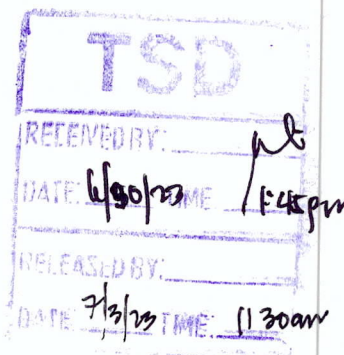
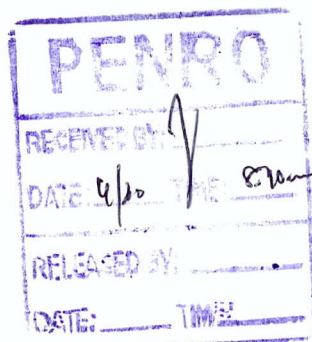

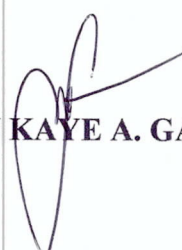

**REPORT ON THE MONITORING OF WILDLIFE TRAFFIC MONITORING UNIT OF
CENRO SAN JOSE IN AIRPORTS AND SEAPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF
JUNE OF CY 2023**

I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In compliance with DENR MIMAROPA Regional Memorandum dated April 22, 2021 regarding the mobilization of Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit (WTMU) in Airports and Seaports in MIMARO Provinces, the Enforcement and Monitoring Section of CENRO San Jose, Occidental Mindoro conducted monitoring in rotational basis with specific task/duties as stated in Rule 33.2 of the Joint DENR-DA-PCSD Administrative Order No. 01, Series of 2004 also known as the Implementing Rules and Regulation (IRR) of Republic Act 9147, otherwise known as the Wildlife Resource Conservation and Protection Act of 2001.

In response to the aforementioned subject, the Enforcement and Monitoring Section of CENRO San Jose, Occidental Mindoro strengthened its Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit (WTMU) composing of:

II. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit (WTMU) conducted monitoring at:

1. San Jose Airport, Brgy. San Roque, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro
2. San Jose Seaport, Brgy. Caminawit, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro
3. Sta. Teresa Seaport, Brgy. Sta. Teresa, Magsayay, Occidental Mindoro

III. MONITORING SUMMARY

a. San Jose Airport Monitoring

San Jose Airport, formerly known as McGuire Airfield, is an airport serving the general area of San Jose, Occidental Mindoro is the only airport within the jurisdiction of CENRO San Jose, Occidental Mindoro. The WTMU coordinated with Mr. Christopher G. Enriquez, manager of the Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP) and main agency responsible for the regulation for aviation of San Jose Airport for the installation of Identification Cards and All Access Pass of the team for better monitoring.

For the month of June of CY 2023, the only available airline company is the Cebu Pacific Airline with flight schedules of:

	9:00 AM – San Jose to Manila

The WTMU consistently monitored the San Jose Airport regarding Wildlife Trafficking for the month of June for CY 2023, however, no violations were monitored and reported, though on June 19, 2023, the staff of San Jose Airport successfully turned over a Malayo Phytan Reticulata that has a length of 321 cm and weight of 14.30 kls. to the WTMU that was found from the airport grounds. The WTMU was accompanied by TCP Staff Mikko Angelo Reyes and the snake was brought to the TCP for proper custody.

b. San Jose Seaport Monitoring

San Jose Seaport, also known as Caminawit Port, is the main seaport overseeing sea travels from Ilin and Ambulong Islands of San Jose, Occidental Mindoro, and also sea travels to and from Coron, Palawan and Semirara Island, Caluya, Antique. The WTMU coordinated with Mr. Delfin Lazaro, manager of Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) and main agency responsible for the regulation of voyages of San Jose Seaport for support to Wildlife Traffic Monitoring via water transport and installation of DENR Desk on March 11, 2022. The WTMU also coordinated with Barangay Local Government Unit of Caminawit, PNP Maritime and Philippine Coast Guard for collaboration on strict monitoring of illegal activities.

For the month of June of CY 2023, the present vessels and travel coats:

1. Caminawit Port A : (Big Vessels)

a. MV Argo De Oro II (Passenger – Cargo Vessel)

- Semirara Island, Caluya, Antique to San Jose, Occidental Mindoro every Monday and Wednesday at 6:00 AM
- San Jose, Occidental Mindoro to Semirara Island, Caluya, Antique every Tuesday and Thursday at 10:30 AM

2. Caminawit Port B : (Small Vessels)

a. MV Kalayaan XI (Passenger Vessel)

- Back and forth San Jose, Occidental Mindoro to Semirara Island, Caluya Antique with indefinite schedule

b. MV Roxanne (Passenger and Cargo Vessel)

- Back and forth San Jose, Occidental Mindoro to Semirara Island, Caluya Antique with indefinite schedule

c. Motorized Passenger Boats

- Back and forth Caminawit Seaport, Brgy. Caminawit, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro to Ilin and Ambulong Islands, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro everyday

d. BUNSO Transport (Passenger Vessel)

- San Jose, Occidental Mindoro to Coron, Palawan every Tuesday, and Saturday at 12:00 NN
- Arrival to San Jose, Occidental Mindoro from Coron, Palawan every Monday, and Friday at 12:00 NN

The Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit (WTMU) consistently monitored the San Jose Seaport for violations of RA 9147 but also for the monitoring of other Environmental Laws like PD 705. However, for the month of June for CY 2023, the WTMU did not find any violations regarding the illegal Wildlife Trafficking. The WTMU will continue to monitor the San Jose Seaport for the protection of our environment and natural resources.

c. Sta. Teresa Seaport Monitoring

Sta. Teresa Seaport located at Brgy. Sta. Teresa, Magsaysay, Occidental Mindoro is a port made to oversee sea travel from Magsaysay to Ilin and Ambulong Islands, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro and also sea travels from Manila and Batangas.

Also, recently according to the LGU Magsaysay, Montenegro Shipping Lines will be available once the port opens with operations from Sta. Teresa, Magsaysay, Occidental Mindoro to Brgy. Caticlan, Malay, Aklan and vice versa.

However, Sta. Teresa Seaport is still non-operational as to date but according to LGU Magsaysay, Occidental Mindoro, the operation of the Sta. Teresa Seaport will start as soon as the port is fully finished.
