Meanwhile, a total of 22 sacks and 8 garbage bags of non-biodegradable trash were collected in the 880m coastal area of Barangays Balite and Pachoca, Calapan City.

A Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) on ocean and coral conservation, and coastal clean-up were successfully conducted in the Barangays of Balite and Pachoca, Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro in celebration of the WOD 2023 and CTD 2023. The activities were held on June 9, 2023. The site is within the Verde Island Passage (VIP) and near the outlets of Calapan River and Baruyan River. Further, the area is regarded as marine turtle nesting site. The activities were attended by 75 participants (32 male and 43 female) coming from volunteers and CENRO Socorro, Oriental Mindoro with age groups ranging from 22-64 years old.

The topics discussed during the CEPA include the background of coastal and marine ecosystems of the area; the significance of WOD and CTD; and, ecosystem services, threats, adverse impacts of degradation, and ways to conserve and protect the corals and ocean.

After the CEPA, several participants were designated as recorders while the rest of participants served as collectors of garbage for the coastal clean-up. The Volunteer Ocean Trash Data Form from Ocean Conservancy Organization (2022/ latest version) was used to record and analyze the waste collected. A total of 22 sacks and 8 garbage bags of non-biodegradable trash were collected in the 880 m coastal area of the Barangays of Balite and Pachoca. These came from coastal households and/ or carried by water bodies (Calapan River, Baruyan River and/ or ocean).

In the data collected per the duly filled-out Volunteer Ocean Trash Data Form, the *Most Likely to Find Items* category has the most number of trash, totaling to 1,404 pieces or 73.16% of the total 1,919 garbage pieces recorded. The *food wrappers (coffee, chips, etc.)* are the trash under the aforementioned category with the most number – 385 pieces.



The Top 1 trash category is followed by *Other Items/ Debris category* with 249 pieces (12.98%), *Packaging Material category* with 119 pieces (6.20%), *Tiny Trash Less Than 2.5 cm category* with 108 pieces (5.63%), *Personal Hygiene category* with 35 pieces (1.82%) and lastly by *Fishing and Boating category* with 4 pieces or 0.21%. Neither *Illegal Dumping* nor *Dead/ Injured Animals* were noted. The trash collected was turned-over to the Barangay LGUs for proper management and disposition.

Further, the official digital designs/ banners of WOD 2023 and CTD 2023 were produced and used during the conduct of regular special events. At the same time, these were installed at the information desk and front of CENRO Socorro on June 8 and 9, 2023. The digital designs/ banners are made of paper (*tarpaper*). This is an initiative of the office in joining the celebration and to inform the public about the regular special event related to coastal and marine protection, conservation and management.

Likewise, about 15 Information, Education and Communication (IEC) campaign materials were distributed to the LGU of Barangay Balite, Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro (marine turtle nesting site) to serve as their reference in the formulation and/ or implementation of Programs/ Activities/ Projects (PAPs) related to the conservation, management and protection of marine turtles and their coastal and marine resources.

A Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) on ocean and coral conservation, and coastal clean-up were successfully conducted in the Barangays of Balite and Pachoca, Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro in celebration of the WOD 2023 and CTD 2023 (see Figure 1). The activities were held on June 9, 2023. The site is within the Verde Island Passage (VIP) and near the outlets of Calapan River and Baruyan River. Further, the area is regarded as marine turtle nesting site. The activities were attended by 75 participants (32 male and 43 female) coming from volunteers and CENRO Socorro, Oriental Mindoro with age groups ranging from 22-64 years old.



The CEPA started at 7:00 am. The personnel of CENRO Socorro facilitated the preliminaries of the program. After which, Barangay Chairperson Juanito M. Alveyra of Barangay Pachoca provided welcoming remarks and expressed his heartfelt gratitude for the time and effort of participants in support to the event. Then, the CEPA proper proceeded.

The CENR Officer Rodel M. Boyles of DENR-CENRO Socorro, shared the background of coastal and marine ecosystems of the area. Philippines is located at the apex of Coral Triangle. This area is considered as the center of marine biodiversity. At the same time, Calapan City is within the Verde Island Passage. This area is regarded by International Scientists as the center of center of marine shore fish diversity.

The World Ocean's Day (WOD) is celebrated every 8<sup>th</sup> Day of June while the Coral Triangle Day (CTD) is celebrated every 9<sup>th</sup> Day of June. With the theme "Planet Ocean: Tides are Changing", WOD 2023 aims to raise awareness on the importance of ocean to our lives. Further, the theme of CTD 2023 for this year is "Oceans Need Action" which underscores the need for concrete actions and emphasize the urgency to move beyond plans for our oceans.

Meanwhile, City ENR Officer Wilfredo G. Landicho profoundly discussed the ecosystem services that the ocean provided, giving emphasis on the provision of food, oxygen, livelihood and habitat of various marine organisms.

During the discourse of the two (2) speakers, they highlighted that despite the benefits provided, our ocean is continuously under threat and pressure because of pollution and other anthropogenic activities. This coastal clean-up is one of the ways to protect and conserve our marine ecosystems. Participants were encouraged to participate in the upcoming coastal clean-ups to be conducted by DENR and other organizers.

The Volunteer Ocean Trash Data Form from Ocean Conservancy Organization (2022/ latest version) was used to record and analyze the waste collected. A total of 22 sacks and 8 garbage bags of non-biodegradable trash were collected in the 880 m coastal area of the Barangays of Balite and Pachoca (see Figure 3). These came from coastal households and/ or carried by water bodies (Calapan River, Baruyan River and/ or ocean).

In the data collected per the duly filled-out Volunteer Ocean Trash Data Form, the *Most Likely to Find Items* category has the most number of trash, totaling to 1,404 pieces or 73.16% of the total 1,919 garbage pieces recorded. The *food wrappers (coffee, chips, etc.)* are the trash under the aforementioned category with the most number – 385 pieces (see Tables 1-2).

The Top 1 trash category is followed by *Other Items/ Debris* category with 249 pieces (12.98%), *Packaging Material* category with 119 pieces (6.20%), *Tiny Trash Less Than 2.5 cm* category with 108 pieces (5.63%), *Personal Hygiene* category with 35 pieces (1.82%) and lastly by *Fishing and Boating* category with 4 pieces or 0.21%. Neither *Illegal Dumping* nor *Dead/ Injured Animals* were noted. The sacks and garbage bags of trash were turned-over to the Barangay LGUs for proper management and disposition (see Tables 1-2).


