Respectfully submitted is the Memorandum dated February 27, 2023 of OIC, PENRO Romblon regarding the above subject in compliance with the target under OO1: Natural Resources Conservation and Development Program: Protected Areas, Caves and Wetlands Development and Management Sub-program: I. Proclaimed and Legislated PAs: 4. PA Habitat Protection; A. Biodiversity Monitoring System (BMS) within CALSANAG Watershed Forest Reserve (CWFR) in Romblon for the 1ST Semester CY 2023.

BMS was conducted using Focus Group Discussion, Transect Walk, Field Diary and Photo Documentation.

1. FOCUS GROUP DISCUSSION (FGD)

FGD was conducted on February 25, 2023 at Sitio Upper Pader, Balogo, Calatrava, Romblon. It was participated by nineteen (19) members of the Community Monitoring Group (CMG). The CMG members actively participated in providing information on the trends of biodiversity and resource uses within the protected area. It is reported that the most used resources are "baliw" leaves, timbers, freshwater fishes and shrimps.

2. TRANSECT WALK

Table 1 below shows the priority species monitored within the established 2km transect line in Sitio Upper Pader, Brgy. Balogo, Calatrava Romblon.







This office respectfully submits the NGP Project DIME Report as of May 2023, with regards to the List of Contracts (Table 1), Maintenance and Protection (M&P Forms) and Year 2 and 3 Financial Status for your information, review, and record.

Hereunder is a brief discussion of our accomplishment based on the three (3) significant performance indicators: area contracted, area maintained and protected, and financial performances.

NGP Targets vs Area Contracted

As of May 2023, the MIMAROPA Region through its implementing PENROs and CENROs had completed 5,192.00 hectares or 99.81% of the 5,202.00 hectares target area. Two families with 10 hectares in contract to PENRO Occidental Mindoro did not continue their maintenance and protection. Meanwhile, a total of 231 families have been engaged under the MIMAROPA Region, 51 were contracted for second year plantation establishment, 180 for third year plantation establishment under PENRO Marinduque and PENRO Oriental Mindoro. In terms of Memorandum of Agreement, there are 647 contracts for the second year and third year maintenance and protection of NGP plantation establishment.

This pertains to the monitoring of the installed watershed monitoring instruments within the Mag-asawang Tubig River Watershed and the Bongabong River Watershed, two key watershed areas in Oriental Mindoro. This is in compliance with the target under OO1 Natural Resources Sustainably Managed Natural Resources Enforcement and Regulatory Program: Soil Conservation and Watershed Management including River Basin and Management and Development: 4. Watershed Instrumentation: Operationalization of Watershed Instrumentation: 2. Maintenance and Protection of the Monitoring System: b. Monitoring of watershed instruments in Mag-asawang Tubig River Watershed and Bongabong River Watershed.

Per monitoring conducted by the personnel of the Conservation and Development Division, the data logger of Automated Weather Station (AWS) in Mag-asawang Tubig River Watershed located at the Department of Agriculture-Regional Integrated Agricultural Research Center (DA-RIARC) Station in Victoria, Oriental Mindoro was found defective. In addition, hereunder are the other notable observations on the watershed monitoring instruments:

Hagan, Bonbabong AWS

- The levelling bubble in the Pyranometer has dried up;
- The outer casing of the Rain Gauge has cracks; and
- The air temperature and relative humidity sensor head has holes in its filter


Macatoc, Victoria AWS

 The soil moisture meter is damaged, and the relative humidity sensor has erroneous readings beyond the normal range

Relative hereto, this Office has retrieved the data logger installed at the DA-RIARC station and has sent to Phillnstruments for inspection and possible replacement.



2. Field Diary

During the course of foot patrolling by the Park Rangers, resources used were recorded such as Rattan, Ubod, Bago, Mud Crab, Wood worm, Rambutan and Cassava for food consumption in So. Kakawitan, So. Tagbologo, and So. Pasi in Culasian, Jose P. Rizal.

3. PHOTO DOCUMENTATION

Series of photo documentation were done in the three (3) established sites:1) Sitio Kakawitan, Tagusao, Quezon, 2) Sitio Darapiton, Culasian, Jose P. Rizal and 3) Sitio Maribong, Pulot Interior, Sofronio Espanola. No negative changes were observed in these areas.



BMS was conducted using five (5) methods: Field Diary, Transect Swim, Transect Walk, Photo Documentation, and Focus Group Discussion.

1). Field Diary

During the conduct of regular patrolling in Barangays Tumbod, Alcalain, Bato, Banbanan, New Guinlo, Old Guinlo, Pancol, and Poblacion all in Taytay, Palawan, several important faunal species were recorded such as Palawan Hornbill (*Anthracoceros marchei*), Bluenaped Parrot (*Tanygnathus lucionensis*), Grey Imperial Pigeon (*Ducula pickeringii*), Hooded Pitta (*Pitta sordida*), Bluenheaded racket-tail (*Prioniturus platenae*) and Palawan Shama (*Copsychus niger*).

2) Photo Documentation

During the conduct of the Transect Walk, photos were taken in three (3) different sites: Old and New Watershed Areas of Brgy. New Guinlo and Watershed Area of Brgy. Old Guinlo. For the 1st Semester, no significant change was observed.

4) Transect Walk

The activity was conducted within the five (5) established permanent monitoring sites in New and Old Watershed, Brgy. New Guinlo, Sitio Malatek-latek, Brgy. Old Guinlo, Brgy. Banbanan and Alimanguan, San Vicente, Palawan. Data shows that the Olived-winged bulbul is the most dominant species in all sites except in Alimanguan, San Vicente, Palawan where the Blue Flycatcher is the most dominant.

Summarized below are the fauna species with the highest count observed in five (5) established sites for the 1st Semester of 2023.

Respectfully submitted is the Compliance Monitoring Report dated May 17, 2023 including the prescribed forms such as compliance monitoring, inventory, and breeding report forms form covering the 2nd Quarter of CY 2023 on the issued Wildlife Farm Permit (WFP), Wildlife Collector's Permit (WCP) for breeding and Certificate of Wildlife Registration (CWR) in the province of Oriental Mindoro.

Based on the report, there are two permittees under the jurisdiction of CENRO Roxas, Oriental Mindoro: one (1) WFP/WCP holder and one (1) CWR holder. The former was found to be compliant with the terms and conditions stipulated in the approved permit while the latter was found to be partially compliant. Moreover, Mr. Joseph Dimalanta, a CWR holder under the jurisdiction of CENRO Socorro who is physically incapable of taking care of wildlife species (Philippine deer) transferred the said species to Mr. Enriquez of Brgy. San Juan, Bongabong, Oriental Mindoro which is under the jurisdiction of CENRO Roxas, Oriental Mindoro. Hence, the CWR No. 008-05 is now zero stock, considered ceases to exist, and be removed from the existing databases.

A Memorandum dated June 06, 2023 was issued to PENRO Oriental Mindoro to act on the recommended action by the Regional Monitoring Team.
