

This pertains to the target activity on PA Habitat Protection item A Biodiversity Monitoring System (BMS) under Protected Area Management and Development Sub Program for Malampaya Sound Protected Landscape and Seascape (MSPLS), Taytay-San Vicente, Palawan for 1st Semester of Calendar Year 2023.

Please be informed that on February 07, 2023 to March 17, 2023 the Protected Area Management Office (PAMO) of MSPLS personnel, conducted a series of transect walk monitoring at the established monitoring sites in Barangays New Guinlo, Old Guinlo and Banbanan, Taytay and Barangay Alimanguan, San Vicente, Palawan. The team were composed of three (3) females and ten (10) males. Focus Group Discussion (FGD) meeting was also conducted at the Sitio Yakal, Barangay New Guinlo, Taytay on February 23, 2023 and in Bgy. Banbanan, Taytay, Palawan on March 17, 2023. During FGD, the issues and concerns raised by the FGD members is the illegal fishing activity specifically the trawl fishing within inner sound of MSPLS in Sitio Yakal, Barangay New Guinlo and sand and gravel extraction along the river of Barangay Banbanan by local communities for the construction of their residential house. The said issues and the result of the data gathered were presented in the Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) meeting of MSPLS on April 27, 2023 for management intervention.

Biodiversity monitoring activities for the period revealed that Sunbird (Aethopyga sp.) is the most common species in the all established monitoring sites in New and Old Watershed, Bgy. New Guinlo, Palawan, Sitio Malatek-latek, Bgy. Old Guinlo, Bgy. Banbanan, Taytay and Purok 5, Bgy. Alimanguan, San Vicente, Palawan. Indicator/Priority species such as Blue-naped Parrot, Grey Imperial Pigeon, Blue Headed Racket Tail Parrot, Palawan Horbill, Hooded Pitta and Palawan Shama were also monitored in these areas.

Biodiversity Monitoring Report

1. Introduction

The Biodiversity Monitoring System (BMS) aims to improve the information available for decision-makers in protected areas through the regular collection of data on natural biological resources and their utilization. The focus is on *identifying trends* in biodiversity and its use so as to *guide action* in PA management. In addition, the BMS is intended to improve the participation of protected area communities in PA management.

The BMS includes four (4) methods:

- 1. **Focus Group Discussion (FGD)** are held semester in Sitio Yakal, Bgy. New Guinlo, Taytay and Bgy. Banbanan, Taytay, Palawan. This methods generates information regarding trends in use of resources, trends in status of selected resources, and trends in status of households benefiting from the use of resources. The information is mainly based on local communities own perception of trends. Data gathered continuously from a number of representative communities can provide a valid picture of general trends.
- 2. Field Diaries are used by Forest Rangers and Park Rangers during regular patrols and other field activities in the protected area. This method comprises standardized recording of routine observations on resources use and wildlife in a simple pocketbook or data sheet. Information may be own observations or second-hand information.
- 3. **Photo Documentation** is done at the Old and New Watershed areas of Bgy. New Guinlo and at the Watershed Area of Bgy.Old Guinlo, Taytay, Palawan permanent points by taking photos of the landscape form the same place every semester. The new photos are compared with older ones to detect changes in the forest cover.
- 4. **Transects** are somewhat similar to routine patrolling using filed diary. However, transects are permanent demarcated routes where there are precise recommendations on where to walk (or sail or swim), when to do it, and what to note. Transects are undertaken along five (5) permanent transect routes every semester.




Photo No. 1 - Old Watershed Area, New Guinlo, Taytay, Palawan





The activity was conducted within the five (5) established permanent monitoring sites in New and Old Watershed, Bgy. New Guinlo, Sitio Malatek-latek, Bgy. Old Guinlo, Bgy. Data shows that Olived-winged bulbul is the most dominant species in all sites except in Alimanguan, San Vicente, Palawan were the Bluebird Flycather is the most dominant. Other species were also observed in all sites which categorized in the list of threatened, endemic and economically important species in the area.
