I. INTRODUCTION

This pertains to the call from the Human Resource Development Service (HRDS), through the Training and Development Division (TDD), in collaboration with the Environmental Law Enforcement Protection Service (ELEPS) of the DENR Central Office for the proposed conduct of the above-mentioned specialized course. (*Please refer to the attached copy of the memorandum dated January 23, 2023 with enclosures, as Annex "A"*)

The purpose of the training or learning event is to strengthen the environmental law enforcement capacity of the Department through training, and it will also serve as a platform to improve coordination among enforcement agencies, particularly in forestry, wildlife, protected areas, coastal resources, and water resources.

There were revisions of the schedules of the training starting from March 1 to 28, 2023, and finally the schedule was set and the training conducted from April 16, 2023 to May 10, 2023, at the ENR Academy, R.A. Padilla, Carranglan, Nueva Ecija. (*Please refer to the attached copy of Special Order No. 2023-151, as Annex "B", Travel Order No. 360, as Annex "C", and Certificate of Appearance, as Annex "D."*)

II. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In order to tackle all the major accomplishments for the duration of the training while I am in the ENR Academy, I photocopied my Daily Learning Journal to serve as the basis of my daily routine and accomplishments because it was also a requirement of the said learning event. The last accomplishment of the Class 608 MASIDKALI (*the previous meaning of MASIDKALI was "Magigiting na Tagapagmasid ng Kalikasan" and the class decided to change it into "Magigiting na Sumusubaybay, Ipaglalaban at Dedikadong Tagapagtanggol ng Kalikasan"*) was the preparation and presentation of a role play per group composed of "TANDIKAN", "AMIHAN", "ISLA QUATRO", and "KAWAYAN."

We are also required to submit the "Re-entry Action Plan" to be submitted on or before May 19, 2023, and the undersigned submitted the said re-entry action plan on May 15, 2023, with corresponding activities to be accomplished within the period of six (6) months from July to December 2023. Another accomplishment of the class was the preparation and finalization of the Class Directory to serve as pamphlet or reading material to maintain the contact information and maintain the initial good working relationships among the students (Class 608 MASIDKALI) of the specialized course on environmental law enforcement and with all the concerned stakeholders within the MIMAROPA Region, especially our uniformed personnel from the Armed Forces of the Philippines, Philippine National Police, Philippine Coast Guard, and Philippine Maritime Group, among others. III. RECOMMENDATION





The Human Resource Development Service (HRDS), through the Training and Development Division (TDD) and in coordination with the Environmental Law Enforcement and Protection Service (ELEPS), will conduct an **ENR Academy Specialized Course on Environmental Law Enforcement (SC-ELE)** on 1 – 28 March 2023 at the ENR Academy, Carranglan, Nueva Ecija. It aims to strengthen the environmental law enforcement capacity of the Department through training. It will also serve as a platform to improve the coordination among enforcement agencies, particularly on forestry, wildlife, protected areas, coastal resources, and water resources.

Target participants are enforcement personnel from the DENR-Community Environment and Natural Resources Offices (CENROs), Philippine National Police (PNP), Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) and Local Government Units (LGUs) of MIMAROPA.

In order to identify qualified participants for the said course, the following general qualifications can be considered in the selection process:

- current duties and responsibilities include strong involvement in all aspects of environmental law enforcement;
- physically and mentally fit to undergo face-to-face learning activities and able to complete the entire course;
- must be a holder of regular/plantilla position in his/her agency/office; and
- fully vaccinated against COVID-19

Moreover, given the limitations of the current learning set-up brought by the pandemic, below is the allocation of slots for all agencies and offices concerned.

• DENR	-	One (1) per CENR Office and implementing PENROs
• PNP	-	Three (3) Police Officers preferably occupying not higher than a rank of a Police Lieutenant
• AFP	-	Three (3) Officers preferably occupying position not higher

than a rank of a Captain (*Army, Navy, Marines and Air Force*)

- PCG - Three (3) Officers preferably occupying position not higher than a rank of a Lieutenant Junior Grade
- LGU - Eight (8) employees involved in ENR law enforcement ideally coming from the municipalities/cities with high record of environmental law enforcement violations and issues (1 staff per Municipality/City)

The Environmental Compliance Code itself will be issued after any critical project with the impact concerned will be issued after the issue of the DMR EMB after the confirmation that the applied conservation areas and project have identified and mitigation measures for the identified →

impacts during the gathering of information to the other of EIS System. It is worth to note while performing my duties as supervisor of Officer of DMR full reason that an ECE is a user for those implemented critical project within the critical areas. The ECE itself is not a license or a permit for a certain establishment. I fear it is a requirement and often option that the said project or proponent has supplied the required EIS system. PULSE" and "NEGATIVE BREATHING"
immediately apply the CPR with
ordinary counting of 1 to 20
