I. EVALUATION OF THE COURSE:

• Technical Content:

The Capacity Building training is all about Sustainable Tourism, its concept and importance. It has been realized that our country relies its 30% of GDP from the tourism industry; further, all in order for the MPAs to be self-sustaining, it also relies on the IPAF collection. Though, tourism has higher impacts to our ecosystem, this training capacitated the participants on the understanding of Sustainable Tourism and steps to ensure that while our country will benefits from the Sustainable Tourism Industry, the ecosystem (coastal and marine ecosystem) are still being maintained. conserved and protected. Some of the lectures talk about the importance to have an inventory of the 3 A's- the Attractions, Accommodations and Accessibility before leaning towards the Tourism, Stakeholder Analysis on their contribution to the MPA and the SWOT Analysis. The training also introduced the Carrying capacity and its importance and then highlighted the Limit of Acceptable Change (LAC). The LAC focuses on how much change of our resources as effect of tourism is tolerable to the MPA managers and the management intervention that will be implemented if the impact is within the threshold. They also emphasized that the LAC can only be implemented if the MPA have a Full Site Assessment (data) of their resources. On the last day of training, the Green Fins approach were presented. This Approach will allow the stakeholders to be a good steward of the marine and coastal ecosystem by following all the ICONs and COC's.

• Impressions/Comments:

The capacity building is excellent, though, the undersigned is expecting to have a discussion on the steps of crafting of Eco-tourism Management Plan.

The participants is well-versed on the message on the Sustainable Tourism after the training.
