

### IV. READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Leonard T. Caluya, CENR Officer of DENR Brooke's Point.

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The Presiding Officer Mr. InocencioMagallanes requested the body toreview the previous minutes of PAMB Meeting and asked for their comments.

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Mr. InocencioMagallanes suggested to use guests instead of observers. He further suggested to the board to review the drafted minutes of meeting on their emails since the PAMB Secretariat already sent copy in their email address.

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Mr. JunaideDawilisuggested to send them in advance the hard copy of the drafted minutes especially to those PAMB members that have no email address for them to review it

before the PAMB meetingand for them to mark comments and/or corrections in the minutes. Such suggestions was accepted by the PAMB Secretariat.

After minor comments/correction and suggestions on the drafted minutes, previous minutes of the meeting had been approved upon motion of MENRO Reynaldo Rivera and duly seconded by Mr. Pablo Molejon of RTNMPA.

### V. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE PREVIOUS MINUTES OF MEETING

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes asked the body if they have questions, comments or issues from the previous minutes that need to be discussed. He further asked the PAMB Secretariat regarding the status of the approved Resolution adopting the Municipal Ordinance No. 002 of Municipality of Bataraza declaring the Nicobar Pigeon as the flagship species of the said municipality during the last quarter PAMB meeting CY 2022.

ECOMS I/ PA Staff Mary Cris A. Ibañez replied that they already submitted the said Resolution last December 2022 together with other MOVs for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter submission of accomplishments and the PASu/PAMO have no comment/s received from the Regional Office regarding the said resolution.

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes thenproposed that it should be included on the BMB's technical bulletin.

Forester Leonard T. Caluya, CENR Officer of DENR Brooke's Point, Palawan informed the board that the CENRO office received the latest instruction from the BMB that the Ursula Island Game Refuge and Bird Sanctuary shall be replaced and finally named as Ursula Island Wildlife Sanctuary. He further requested/suggested that the name be declared by the board.

Request of CENRO was accepted and approved by the board to declare UIWS as the name of protected area Ursula in the form of Resolution.

PASu Franklin M. Aquino added that renaming of UIGRBS into UIWS was also tackled during his attendance in the Workshop for drafting the Bill for the Legislation of protected areas. He informed the board that the higher offices already using the UIWS as the name of protected area Ursula. Further he informed the board that the final area of the Ursula is 650.89 hectares per review and validation of NAMRIA. Butduring their workshop on drafting the bill for the legislation of protected area Ursula, the area is more or less 651 hectares as suggested by the NAMRIA. He also added that the area submitted for proclamation of Ursula is 650.39 hectares.

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes asked PASu Franklin Aquino if the PAMB Secretariat assisted the Sangguniang Bayan of Bataraza in Formulation of Municipal Ordinance particurly in Environmental fee to be imposed in Opening the Ursula Island to Visitors.

PASu Franklin Aquino suggested to have special meeting of the Technical Working Group of UIWS PAMB regarding the review and finalization of the Protocol for Opening the Ursula Island to Visitors and to discuss the amount of fees to be imposed.

Mr.Magallanes also suggested that the fees will be collected by the LGU Bataraza while waiting for the proclamation or legislation of Ursula.

Such suggestions was accepted by the board.

### 1. Presentation of DENR WFP CY 2023 and Schedule of activities

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ECOMS I/PA Staff Mary Cris A. Ibañez presented the DENR Work and Financial Plan to the PAMB Members for them to be informed on the WFP targets of the DENR pertaining to Protected Area Management, Protection and Conservation. The following programs with corresponding budget allotment and tenatative schedule of the conduct of activities had been presented.

Forester Banjo Carorocan asked the PAMB Secretariat if what the CEPA Plan is

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ECOMSII/Planning Officer Rachel Apple informed the board that the CEPA or the Communication Education and Public Awareness Plan is the planned IEC activities to be conducted, IEC materials to be produced and KAP surveys in 5 years. Celebrations and/or festivals are also planned like for example celebration for the flagship species of Ursula and celebration for the proclamation of the protected area Ursula.

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CENRO Leonard T. Caluya added that the CEPA is the term being used by the Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB) for the Information Education Campaign (IEC) in protected area.

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• Printing of Photochecklist of Species and Customized Collaterals (May to June 2023)

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PASu Franklin Aquino asked suggestions from the board regarding the customized collaterals to be produced that can accommodate the budget allotment for the production of CEPA Materials.

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Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes asked the PAMB Secretariat what is customized collaterals.

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ECOMSII/Planning Officer Rachel Appie replied that customized collaterals are like personalized items like key chains, notebooks and souvenir items which indicates important biological features of the protected area Ursula that will be distributed during the conduct of IEC.

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Presiding Officer asked who will provide the design of the CEPA Materials.

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ECOMS II Rachel Appie replied that PAMB Secretariat will provide/draft the design based on the available fund for the production of CEPA Materials and will be presented to the PAMB for their review, comments and approval. She also added that they already have the submitted design of the Photochecklist of Species (flora and fauna) waiting for comments and approval of the DENR Regional Office.

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Presiding Officer requested to show the sample of Photochecklist of Species to PAMB Members so that they could check and see the contents. He further asked the PAMB Secretariat the cost needed for the production of photochecklist of species.

ECOMS II Rachel Appie replied that it will depend on the type of materials to be used in printing and to the budget allocation for the production of the CEPA materials.

PASu Franklin M. Aguino informed the board that there were two (2) declared facilities in Ursula Island. The comfort rooms and Ranger House which was hit and /or damaged last year by the storm surge on December 27, 2022. But before the storm surge, the DENR CENRO Brooke's Point initially conducted maintenance of the facilities like changing the roofing structure of the Ranger House. PASu proposed to put ceiling and walls of the ranger house from this year's budget allotment for the maintenance of facilities.

ECOMS I/PA Staff Mary Cris A. Ibañez presented to the board the prepared training design for the conduct of 1st quarter Training on Biodiversity Assessment and Monitoring System (BAMS) for the information of the board as participants.

ECOMS II Rachel Appie informed the board that the objective of this training is not only to capacitate the DENR-CENRO Brooke's Point Personnel, UIWS Secretariat and other PAMB members in the conduct of BMSbut to standardized the methods of biodiversity monitoring conducted in the island by several agencies and partner organizations based on BMB Technical Bulletin since RTNMC and CBNC are conducting the BMS in protected area Ursula, To create and establish the biodiversity database of UIWS in preparation for the proclamation and formulation of management plan, . She further asked the board to recommend number of participants who will represent per PAMB member's office/organization/agency who will directly involve in the BMS monitoring in the island.

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes asked each PAMB members/representatives present to recommend number of participants in this office/agency/organization.

CBNC Representative ArnelCalinga asked what will be the output like annual assessment and monitoring report after the conduct of the training. Further suggested the participants in the training to participate in the conduct if BMS monitoring and/or assessment in the island in order for them to apply and or practice what they have learned from the training.

Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes added a suggestion to have Biodiversity Work Plan after the conduct of training since it is a continuing practice and/or implementation of the BMS Technical Bulletin.

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ECOMS II Rachel Appie added that it is the reason why PAMB members need to be capacitated with the BAMS because the result or the annual assessment and monitoring report will be presented to them and PAMB members know the methods used in the conduct of assessment and monitoring for them tounderstand, analyze and interpret the monitoring data to be presented. She also added that in base lining and establishment of permanent plots all PAMB members/representatives are required to attend or participate. But in monitoring activity, only selected DENR personnel, UIWS Secretariat and PAMB members and/or representatives and will participate.

Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes encouraged the PAMB members/representatives to participate in the training and suggested to create a framework after the training. He further suggested to PAMB Secretariat to discuss the number of participants in CENRO level and consider the budget for the said training versus the number of participants.

PASu Franklin Aquino suggested to reschedule the conduct of BAMS training together with the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter PAMB meeting since all PAMB members will participating in the said training.

ECOMS II Rachel Appleagreed to PASuto adjust the date of the training and suggested to the board to conduct first the other training that have less participants for the 1st quarter accomplishment, the Training on Proper rescue, handling and release of Wildlife which will be participated by selected DENR Personnel, UIWS FPOs and Blue guards and other concerned PAMB Members/representatives.

The board agreed to suggestions to conduct first the Training on Proper rescue, handling and release of Wildlife for 1st quarter and Training on BAMS simultaneously with the 2nd quarter PAMB meeting.

As agreed by the board, participants are the PAMB members, selected DENR-CENRO Brooke's Point Personnel, UIWS Secretariat and Blue Guards. A total of fifty seven (57) persons will be participating in the said training with the following breakdown:

ECOMS II Rachel Appie asked clarification from the PAMB members if who will conduct the 100% Timber Inventory and how will be the disbursement of fund allotted for the activity since the budget is counterpart of CBNC and RTNMC.

PASu Franklin Aquino suggested to the board to include the name tagging of trees in the island from the budget allotted for the conduct of 100% Timber Inventory.

CENRO Leonard T. Caluya suggested and/or requested to hear statement from the concerned PAMB member/s.

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CBNC Representative ArnelCalingareplied that they can also conduct the 100% Timber Inventory in the island simultaneously with the conduct of Annual Biodiversity Monitoring being conducted by CBNC in the island. However, the budget allotment was counterpart of two companies the RTNMC and CBNC. He further added that they can also discuss it with RTNMC and/or they will request experts from DENR who will conduct the 100% timber inventory in the form of contract.

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Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes also suggested the DENR personnel to conduct the timber inventory. But they must be compensated with that work, he said.

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CBNC Representative ArnelCalinga suggested to DENR to make a request pertaining to the disbursement of fund for the conduct of 100% Timber Inventory.

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Such suggestion was accepted by CENRO Leonard Caluya and PAMB Secretariat.

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✓ Conduct of 100% Marine Assessment

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ECOMS IIRachel Appie replied that RTNMC and CBNC allotted fund for the conduct of 100% marine assessment and the PAMB Secretariat have no idea and/or background regarding the design and/or methods of conducting the activity and on the identification of marine species.

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Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes proposed Haribon Palawan to provide the design and/or methodology following the DENR guidelines and new BMB Technical bulletins for the conduct of marine assessment and will be presented to the board. He further suggested and encouraged the PAMB members to conduct the activity together with the selected DENR personnel. cki

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### 3. **Updates on UIGRBS Activities**

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PA Accomplishment Report (PASu Franklin M. Aquino)

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Protected Area Superintendent Franklin M. Aquino reported the following activities conducted in the protected area Ursula: Seaborne and Foot patrolling, initial maintenance of facilities like cottages in the island hit/damaged by the storm surge last December 2022, maintenance of M/V Ursula *banca* like repainting and changing of *katig*. He also informed the board that the Ranger House, comfort rooms and hatchery area in the island was damaged by the strong waves and sand shifting due to storm surge or shear line last December 2022. He added that they are planning to conduct actual assessment of facilities needed to be maintained in the island. He further added an update on Status of Ursula*Banca*donated by CBNC that the Deed of Donation was sent back to him because per advice of the PENRO, the amount of *banca* must be included and/or indicated in the Deed of Donation.

CBNC Representative ArnelCalinga asked clarification if they need to send new notarized form of Deed of Donation with amount indicated or if they will send an attachment pertaining to the amount of *banca* in support to the previous notarized Deed of Donation since it was already notarized in Taguig City, Philippines.

PASu Franklin Aquino replied to ask and/or confirm it first to the PENRO office considering the CBNC concern and he will inform CBNC once there is an instruction.

 PASu Aquino added and asked the board to recommend Civil Engineer who will make the program of works for the maintenance of ranger house and other facilities in Ursula Island since one of the requirements to disburse the budget allotted for the maintenance is the program of works.

### • FPOs Reports/Updates

FPO Raul Molejon reported their accomplishments form December 2022 to February 2023 through PowerPoint presentation. Their activities conducted are the following:

### a. Marine Turtle Monitoring

 ❖ December 09, 2022- A total of 106 eggs of Hawksbill turtle was transplanted to the hatchery area.

January 20, 2023 -

A total of 95 eggs of Hawksbill turtle was transplanted to the hatchery area.

**\*** February 5-6, 2023-

A total of 153 eggs of Hawksbill turtle was transplanted to the hatchery area.

### b. Bird Counting

 FPO Raul Molejon informed the board that based on their observation, birds are now in the adjacent island of Ursula. There are sightings of Kamaso in Amerill Island.

 Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes then suggested to PAMB Secretariat to take note of the information of FPO Raul Molejon and instructed the FPO to make graphical reporting of bird counts in the island on the next quarter with comparison. Such suggestions are accepted by FPOs and PAMB Secretariat.

c. Conduct of Coastal clean-up and Disposition of Garbage collected from Ursula Island to mainland Bataraza. 1 sack of Bottle, 2 sacks of plastic bottles and 1 sack of Rubber, Styrofoam and plastic wares are collected.

FPO Raul Molejon also presented photos showing the damaged cause by the storm surge or shear line to the island's facilities such as Ranger House, Conference hall and hatchery.

Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes asked recommendations of the board and PASu regarding the incident happened.

PPDO representative Mr. CristitoOmapas suggested to construct an elevated Ranger house like in Tubbataha Reef Natural Park as protection in case the incident will happen again.

ECOMS II Rachel Appie responded that it is not possible this year to reconstruct Ranger house because DENR fund is only allotted for minor maintenance of facilities in the island. There is a need to submit a plan with design signed by an Engineer for the construction and/or establishment of the new building structure in order for us to request fund to either BMB or DENR Regional Office and to be included in the three year infrastructure program of the DENR.

Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes then asked the board who will be the Engineer who will make the design and further suggested to request from the CBNC or RTNMC if there's no Civil Engineer in DENR CENRO office for the preparation of the design. He also added that there must be a technical study first before the design of the structure considering the effect of the shear line in the sand pattern in the island. He further suggested to PASu to request from the BMB experts.

RTNMC Representative Forester Banjo Carorocan suggested to PASu to make a communication letter or request so that RTNMC have the basis to provide an Engineer.

FPO Raul Molejon also reported that there are still illegal fishers within the water vicinity of Ursula Island. There are also times that other illegal fishers are hunting the eggs of marine turtles. He also informed the board that illegal fishers are attacking when they see that the patrol boat is not around the vicinity of Ursula or FPOs and guards are not around especially during weekend. He further requested additional manpower and faster patrol boat in the island.

PASu Franklin Aquino added that it is the reason why they proposed to have a jungkong or a fast type of boat in the WFP of compensation paid by IRMA to augment the issue/s in illegal fishers. He further raised a concern that illegal fishers are rampant in Ursula Island during month of December because guards and FPOs are not around. PASu added an advice to FPOs not to leave the island without the guards. Such suggestion was accepted by FPOs.

### • Partner Enforcement Agencies Report

### 1. Philippine Coast Guard Rio Tuba Station

CGSN1 Joseph Tuse reported that they conducted 3 to 4 times seaborne and foot patrolling in the shoreline every week, conduct of pre-departure inspection (PDI) of pump boat and barge in RTNMC and CBNC and monitoring of incoming and outgoing foreign vessels of RTNMC and CBNC, continuous information drive to boat owners within municipality of Bataraza and renovation of PCG Station at SitioMarabahay, Rio Tuba, Bataraza, Palawan.

PASu Franklin Aquino suggested to PCG to include water vicinities of Ursula Island in their seaborne patrolling and requested their assistance to FPOs and blue guards during their conduct of seaborne patrolling in the island since FPOs are having difficulty in chasing the illegal fishers because fishing boats used by illegal fishers are faster than the patrol boat of FPOs. Such suggestion was accepted by PCG representative.

### 2. PNP Maritime

PMSg Rudy Azares informed the board that they have speedboat that can be used during seaborne patrolling. He further suggested to make letter request to their Commanding Officer when the PAMB would like to borrow the speedboat of Maritime but inform first their PEMS officer Dennis C. Mateo.

### Revision of IRMA WFP CY 2023 as requested by Hon. Abraham Ibba

PASu Franklin Aquino informed the board that Hon. Abraham Ibba approved the IRMA WFP. During his courtesy call, Mayor Ibba proposed to include the procurement of 2 units shot gun with license for DENR law enforcement purpose in emergency cases. PASu asked approval of the body regarding the request/proposal of Honorable Mayor Ibba. Such proposal was accepted and approved by the board present.

PPDO Representative Mr. CristitoOmapas suggested to purchase drone to easily identify the illegal fishers and/or any marks in their boats for their identity.

PASu Franklin Aquino replied that procurement of drone is already included to the WFP of IRMA.

Ms. Virginia Genilan, Municipal Agriculture Officer (MAO) of LGU Bataraza asked clarification what is the purpose of the procurement of 1 unit motorcycle.

PASu Franklin Aquino responded that motorcycle will be used by PAMO Staffs in delivering letters/communications to PAMB members and other activities related to protected area in the mainland.

ECOMS II Rachel Appie informed the board that the copy of the IRMA WFP was already sent to LGU Batarazaand MAO since the compensation paid was in their account and to start the purchasing process.

Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanesreiterated the Approved Resolution of the PAMB last year regarding the release of 1 million compensation paid by RBL Fishing Corporation. He asked the PAMB Secretariat regarding the status of the said resolution since it was knowledge by him that the said company already paid an initial fines/penalties.

PASu Franklin M. Aquino informed the board that the said resolution was not signed by Atty. Noel E. Aquino of PGENRO as the Presiding Officer during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter PAMB meeting which the passage and formulation of the said resolution was raised because the said resolution was approved by the board during the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter PAMB meeting which he was unable to attend that time.

 ECOMS II Rachel Appie deeply enlightened the board that during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter PAMB meeting CY 2022 conducted in Ursula Island, it was deliberated by Atty. Noel Aquino that the RBL Fishing Corporation already paid an initial payment for their compensation and will be donating speedboat etc. Also, it was proposed by Mr.InocencioMagallanes to draft a PAMB Resolution pertaining to the release of fund amounting to 1 million pesos from the compensation paid by RBL Fishing Corporation for the rehabilitation of agrounded area of Ursula Island which was agreed by majority of PAMB members present. And during the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter PAMB meeting presided by Sir InocencioMagallanes, the drafted resolution was approved by the board which Atty. Noel Aquino was unable to attend the said meeting and was not clarified/discussed to him the result of discussion during the said meeting. That's why the resolution was differed and not signed by Atty. Aquino.

 Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes informed the board that on his knowledge the speed boat donated by RBL Company was already in Honda Bay. Further requested to PAMB Secretariat to present the approved PAMB Resolution regarding the said resolution for review and rephrasing of the PAMB. He further signify to continue the passage of the said resolution for the use of Ursula which was agreed by other members/representatives present.

PAMB Secretariat presented and read the contents of the said Resolution entitled "A Resolution Requesting the Provincial Government of Palawan to Immediately Release the Fund Amounting to One Million Pesos from the Compensation Paid by RBL Fishing Corporation for the Rehabilitation of Agrounded Area of Ursula Island Game Refuge and Bird Sanctuary (UIGRBS)".

WHEREAS, the result of assessment revealed that there were two (2) damaged/injured area with a total amount of damages amounting to 10,591,260.00. The first damaged area measures 1,128.96 square meters had a total damage amounting to 7,955,100.00 (computed based on the total area of coral benthic substrate damages of 662.925 square meters) and the second damaged area measures 330 square meters had a total damages amounting to 2,636,172.00 (computed based on total area of coral benthic substrate damages of 219.681square meters) which was computed based on PCSD Resolution No. 12-440;

**WHEREAS**, during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter PAMB Meeting Atty. Noel Aquino informed the body that the final demand of the Province based on the final Resolution of the Governor was 3.1 million because the Management of the RBL Company sent a motion for reconsideration;

**WHEREAS**, during the 2<sup>nd</sup> PAMB meeting, Atty. Noel Aquino Aquino also informed the body that the said company initially paid 1 Million and the remaining balance is payable for one (1) year and the company will be donating 1 unit of speed boat to the Provincial Government for the Biodiversity Initiatives and some important gadgets for the use of Palawan Council for Sustainable Development (PCSD);

**WHEREAS,** during the 2<sup>nd</sup> PAMB meeting Mr. InocencioMagallanes suggested to create a PAMB Resolution for the immediate release of fund for the rehabilitation of Ursula;

WHEREAS, the board agreed on the suggestion and approved the formulation of the Resolution;

**NOW THEREFORE**, on motion of MENRO Reynaldo C. Rivera, duly seconded by Engr. Gonzalo Ong, be it;

**RESOLVED**, as it is hereby RESOLVED by the PAMB UIGRBS by virtue of the power vested in it by law, in third PAMB meeting agreement that this Resolution Requesting the Provincial Government of Palawan to Immediately Release the Fund Amounting to One Million Pesos from the Compensation Paid By RBL Fishing Corporation for the Rehabilitation of Agrounded Area of Ursula Island Game Refuge and Bird Sanctuary (UIGRBS) is hereby **APPROVED**;

After reading important contents of the Resolution, Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanesdenoted that base on the Resolution and on his knowledge, there is already 1 million paid by the RBL Company deposited in the Province of Palawan and the legal basis used in the computation of the damages was the PCSD Resolution No. 12-440 since Ursula was not yet proclaimed and the PAMB has no legal basis in computing damages for agrounding incidents. He further proposed to reiterate of formulate a new resolution for the compensation paid by the company which was agreed by members/representatives present.

Sangguniang Bayan member Hon. GomerMiano suggested to use the fisheries code of the Municipality of Bataraza considering that the protected area Ursula was within the municipal water of Bataraza while waiting for its proclamation and/or legislation. He further proposed that if ever the incident/s will happen again, it must be under the Municipality of Bataraza not in the Province of Palawan.

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes asked SB Miano if they already have an ordinance pertaining to agrounding incidents.

SB GomerMiano replied that there is in their approved fisheries code.

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes then suggested to present in the next PAMB meeting the Fisheries Code of Bataraza for the information of the PAMB members for future use in case there will be another incident happen in Ursula Island and/or within the municipal waters of Bataraza. He added that Provincial Ordinance 1296-13 was also applicable to municipal waters and must be adopted by the Municipality of Bataraza.

SB GomerMiano replied that they already adopted the said Provincial Ordinance in their municipal ordinance last year.

Ms. Virginia Genilan, Municipal Agriculture Officer added that they used the municipal fishery ordinance in the case of IRMA Fishing Vessel Corporation. But in the case of RBL Fishing Corporation, the responsibility was not handed to them even the incident happened within their municipal waters.

Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes suggested to give copy of the Municipal Ordinance which governs the vessel grounding protocols to the PAMB Secretariat. The suggestion was accepted by SB Miano. He further added that in case there will be an incident happen in Ursula, the municipal ordinance will be used and the payment will be in the municipality of Bataraza.

Municipal Agriculture Officer Virginia Genilan recommended LGU Bataraza to formulate resolution requesting the Province of Palawan to transfer the funds/compensation paid by the RBL Fishing Corporation to the Municipal LGU of Bataraza since the last resolution passed by the PAMB was not acknowledged and/or recognized by the Province of Palawan and the Ursula Island is under the jurisdiction of the Municipality of Bataraza.

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes asked comments from the board regarding the proposal of Ms. Virginia Genilan.

PASu Franklin M. Aquino suggested to reiterate the said resolution.

Mr.InocencioMagallanes and other members/representatives present agreed in the amendment and signified to the passage of the resolution.

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes asked somebody to ask in the Provincial Government of Palawan how much the company paid.

Forester Rachel Appie of DENR CENRO Brooke's Point asked the board if how they will inquire in the province.

Mr.Magallanes replied and/or proposed to make a formal letter signed by PASu.

Forester Leonard T. Caluya, CENR Officer of DENR CENRO Brooke's Point added that as head of PAMB Secretariat, PASu can sign on the said request attached with the Resolution from the PAMB. Because we all know that the PAMB and the PASu are the Chief Operating Officer on protected areas as stated in the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the RA 11038 or eNIPAS Act, he said.

Such suggestion and/or proposal was accepted by PASu.

 CENRO Leonard T. Caluya suggested to include in the purpose not only for the rehabilitation of the agrounded area but also for the law enforcement in the Ursula Island Wildlife Sanctuary. Such suggestion was agreed by other members/representatives present.

PPDO Representative Mr.CristitoOmapas suggested to include all the payment "in kind and in cash" of the company. Such suggestion was agreed by members/representatives present.

After thorough discussion, the board members/representatives present come up with the agreement to amend the resolution requesting the Provincial Government of Palawan to transfer all the compensation paid by the RBL Fishing Corporation to Municipal Government of Bataraza for the Rehabilitation and Protection activities of Ursula Island Wildlife Sanctuary (IUWS).

The formulated/revised resolution entitled "A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT OF PALAWAN TO TRANSFER ALL THE PAYMENT BY RBL FISHING CORPORATION TO MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF BATARAZA FOR THE REHABILITATION AND PROTECTION ACTIVITIES OF URSULA ISLAND WILDLIFE SANCTUARY" was unanimously approved by the PAMB members/representatives present in the meeting.

Presiding Officer Mr.Magallanes then suggested to PAMB Secretariat to rephrase other contents/whereas of the resolution and send it to him for review and finalization and f. Such suggestion was acknowledged by the PAMB Secretariat.

MENRO Reynaldo Rivera proposed to furnish copy of the Resolution to Sangguniang Bayan of Bataraza for their information, action and support to the PAMB for the request to Provincial Government of Palawan.

SB Gomer Miano added a suggestion to formulate/draft a resolution requesting the Municipal Government of Bataraza to the release the 1.7 million fund paid by IRMA Fishing Vessel Corporation for the rehabilitation, management, conservation and protection activities of Ursula Island Wildlife Sanctuary based on the approved IRMA WFP CY 2023. Such suggestion was agreed by the members/representatives present and accepted by the PAMB Secretariat.

### • Update on Proclamation UIWS Proclamation

 PASu Franklin Aquino informed the board that the complete papers/documents for the proclamation of Ursula Island was already submitted including the final map and now at the Office of the Secretary for endorsement to the Office of the President. He added that he also attended the workshop in Manila for the drafting of Bill for the legislation of protected areas including the Ursula Island. There are important things they included in the Bill of Ursula Island that was not stated or included in the eNIPAS Act or RA 11038 like in the composition of PAMB Members considering the situation in the Ursula Island. The output of the workshopand complete requirements for the Legislation was also submitted for checking and finalization of the BMB. According to them, Legislation of Ursula may be further preceded by Proclamation since the Bill is supported by Senator Loren Legarda and Legislation is currently the fastest to approve.He further asked recommendation from the board who will communicate to 2<sup>nd</sup> district congressman since the endorsement for the proclamation of Ursula will be coming from the congressman where the protected area is located.

Mr. JunaideDawili suggested to communicate first to Municipal Mayor of Bataraza because it was his knowledge that Hon. Abraham Ibba is personally close to Congressman Alvarez and Ursula Island was within the municipal waters of Bataraza. Maybe Hon. Ibba can help the PAMB to get through an endorsement of Congressman Alvarez and it can be the good accomplishment of the Municipal Government of Bataraza. Such suggestion was acknowledge by PAMB Secretariat.

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### • Update on Hydrologic Study of MGB and Fund for Solar Powered Water Pump

PASu Franklin Aquino informed the board that he sent communication letter to MGB pertaining to the conduct of hydrologic study in Ursula Island last year and reiterated on January this year. He added that during their workshop in drafting the Bill, he also personally informed the MGB regarding the request of the PAMB Ursula to conduct hydrologic study in the island because of the plan to establish/install a Solar Powered Water Pump in the Island. Also informed DENR Regional Executive Director (RED) regarding the plan and the request of PAMB to conduct first the hydrologic study. He was told by RED that it is needed in the island for official use. He informed RED that the purpose of establishing the Solar Powered Water Pump is for supplemental use of Park Rangers and Blue Guards in the island during summer season since there's already rain water collector and tanks in the island.

PASu further asked the board regarding the status of fund allotted by RTNMC/CBNC for the installation of Solar Powered Water Pump.

CBNC representative ArnelCalinga replied that it was included in the CY 2022 WFP which lapsed already and cannot be included in this year's budget allocation of CBNC because the submitted request for budget this year for Ursula was based on the approved WFP CY 2023.

Ms. Janice Tupas, MEPEO of RTNMC recommended to pursue the conduct of hydrologic study since the budget for the installation of Solar Powered Water Pump will be based on the result of hydrologic study. Then the board can plan and decide whether to continue the installation or not base on the resultand discuss it in the regular meeting to include it for the next year's target.

Presiding Officer Mr. Magallanes proposed to formulate a PAMB resolution requesting the MGB to conduct hydrologic study in Ursula Island since the PAMB Secretariat already sent communication letter to them. Members/representatives present agreed and signified to the passage of the resolution.

### • Announcement of schedule for Ratification of Protocol for the Opening of Ursula to Visitors

PAMB members/present agreed to have special meeting of Technical Working Group members pertaining to the Ratification of Protocol for the Opening of Ursula to Visitors which was scheduled March 07, 2023 and at Municipal LGU of Bataraza. *Involved members (DENR, Haribon Palawan, PCSDS, Tourism, MAO, MPDO, LGU Bataraza, Brgy. LGU Rio Tuba, Brgy. LGU Taratak, Brgy. LGU Sarong, PNP Maritime, PCG, MENRO, BFAR, PGENRO, RTNMC and CBNC)*;

### Update on Status of PAMO Office Space and Procurement of Equipment

ECOMS II Rachel Appie informed the board that it was discussed by PAMB Secretariat with CENRO Caluya. CENRO's comment is that there will be needing a personnel who will man the office and who will be that personnel.

CENRO Leonard Caluya added that if there will be PAMO office, there must be hired personnel who will man the office. If there's no hired personnel so we are just making a problem in the future, he said. He further suggested to divert the budget to construct a simple or small hut or waiting shed near the pier to be used as waiting area during the travel to Ursula Island.

PASu Franklin Aquino reiterated his proposal to construct a waiting shed near the pier not only as waiting area during travel to Ursula but also serves as watching/resting area for boat

operator during bad weather. He further suggested to continue the construction of small waiting shed.

Ms. Janice Tupas of RTNMC commented that currently PPA of the company is strict in the development of the company's foreshore lease areaslike establishment of structures although the development is for the DENR's use but docking of the boat is still allowed in the docking area in causeway near the Sitio Marabahay. The company is also reviewing and/or assessing the positions of the law enforcement agencies in the area. She further suggested the Barangay LGU Rio Tuba to provide space near the Coast Guard's station to divert the budget allotted for the PAMO Office Space and Procurement of Equipment to procurement of materials needed in the construction of waiting shed. 

The board agreed to use or impose environmental fee and/or conservation fee and LGU Bataraza will make an ordinance as legal basis in collection of such fee/s.

The board agreed to open Ursula to Visitors. LGU Bataraza will facilitate the collection of fees in the form of environmental or conservation fees which shall also be returned as fund for the conservation and protection of Ursula while waiting for the legislation and proclamation. Once it is already proclaimed and/or legislated, then the PAMO together with the PAMB will open IPAF.
