I hope this message finds you well!

I am reaching out with the intention of asking your good office if you could grant the requests of this municipality to address the problems posed by oil spillage brought by the sunken MT Princess Empress carrying some 800,000 liters of fuel oil which affected the livelihood of fisherfolks as well as seafood vendors and their families.

Last March 4, 2023, locals of Barangay Aplaya sighted a spot of oil forming in their ocean waters about 2 kilometers away from the shoreline and was 0.18 to 1.5-meter thick. Further, a dead fish was found in Barangay Anilao which they believe is due to the oil spillage.

The support from your end will greatly help the Municipal Government of Bongabong to provide both short and long-term solutions and ultimately bring the lives of the affected community back to normal.

Attached is the list of our requests, for your reference.



As per interview to the one of the fisherman living in Barangay Labasan named Allan Bautista, 54 years old, he notice yesterday that the huge amount of oil/chemical spill was spreaded throughout the fishing area in the middle of the sea or what they called "daanan ng barko" with the estimated distance of 5 miles from the shore of their barangay.

He also stated that based on the direction of the wind as of this season it may reach the area of Masaguisi to Roxas, according to him the spill is spreaded in the large portion of the daanan ng barko and he cannot tell the estimated area of spill.











Based on the interview with the Barangay Captains of Camantigue and Cawayan respectively they did not recognized the spill within their area of responsibility, our office advised them to report immediately if they discovered the presence of the said spill.


