I. INTRODUCTION

Illegal wildlife trade is considered as one of the main threats to wildlife resources, all over the world. This act have adverse effects to the ecological balance and probable extinction of some wildlife species.

A Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit was created to ensure the strict compliance and effective implementation of all existing wildlife laws, rules and regulations, including pertinent international agreements. The team have started monitoring in 2021 and continues to date. In the Province of Romblon, there were no illegal species found during the monitoring for the entire period of 2022.

Monitoring activities have also created a stronger partnership with the law both the Philippine National Police and the Philippine Coast Guard. They have been allies in the protection and conservation of the environment and have extended their aid to this office since the activity started, and on other activities involving guarding the environment from lawless citizens.

II. CONDUCT OF WILDLIFE TRAFFIC MONITORING

The ports monitored for February 2023 are as follows;

- 1. Odiongan Port
- 2. Santa Fe Port
- 3. Calatrava Port
- 4. San Agustin Port
- 5. Romblon Port
- 6. Banton Port
- 7. Magdiwang (Ambulong) Port
- 8. Cajidiocan Port (no trip schedule and port activities for February)
- 9. San Jose Port (Port of SAID)
- 10. Alcantara (Tablas Airport)

III. COMMENTS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The continuous monitoring of ports should be facilitated in order to prevent possible illegal wildlife trading. The province is still protected from such activity thus we must be vigilant so that this illegal act will not prosper.






Forest Ranger Rommel Madeja inspects truck for possible illegal wildlife to be trafficked to Batangas. No illegal wildlife present.






TABLAS AIRPORT, ALCANTARA
