COASTAL CLEAN-UP ACTIVITY IN BALABAC

The primary objective of the coastal clean-up activity was to raise awareness about the importance of preserving the marine ecosystem and to promote community involvement in maintaining the cleanliness of the coast.

Date: February 18, 2023

Location: Shoreline of Barangay Poblacion V, Balabac, Palawan

Organizers: Local Government Unit of Balabac

Activities:

The coastal clean-up activity, spearheaded by the LGU Balabac, started at 8:00 am and lasted for two hours. Participants were provided with gloves, trash bags, and other cleaning materials to collect garbage and debris along the shoreline of Poblacion V. The event was divided into different sections, and each group of participants was assigned a specific area to clean.

During the clean-up, participants collected various types of garbage, including plastic bags, bottles, fishing nets, and food containers. They also removed larger items, such as tires, which were found washed up on the beach.

The collected garbage was sorted and categorized before being disposed of in an appropriate manner. Plastic items were separated from other waste to be recycled.

Results:
