SUBJECT : **IEC ACTIVITY REPORT**

The Information, Education, Communication Team respectfully submits the following:

What:

Originally, the IEC activity was arranged by the Municipal (Taytay) Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) in collaboration with the Zoological Society of London (ZSL) and the Office, though its IEC Team, was supposed to be joining only where the team readied to interact with the crowd on various environmental issues, policies, laws and regulations like Presidential Decree 705, Public Land Act as amended, Solid Waste Management, Presidential Decree 1252, Presidential Decree 1067, Chainsaw Act with mention of the Strategic Environmental Laws of Palawan (SEP), Climate Change, The Wildlife Act, the Clean Water Act and other more.

Where:

The receiving community is Sitio Sader of Barangay Bantulan, Municipality of Taytay, Province of Palawan. Per the approved Cad 841-D survey returns, Case 12, Bantulan is about eight (8) kilometres by tie line from the central community of the municipality of Taytay going southeast. Sitio Sader is still beyond five (5) kilometres southeast also of the central community of Barangay Bantulan. The community is within the forest zone but it was a general observation that soil at the place are fertile. The place was about a half an hour travel by the service vehicle and the activity held at the Multipurpose Hall (Figure 1).



When:

The activity was held on February 10, 2023 at the Barangay/Sitio Hall in Sader. The team was on time of schedule at 9: o’ clock in the morning but the gathering of residents took some time that the team also used the opportunity of extending extra services in blood pressure testing, especially for senior citizens (Figure 2). The whole activity lasted from around 9:00 o’ clock in the morning to around 11:30 o’ clock in the morning.



Who and Whom:

On avoidable circumstances, ZSL was not able to join as well as the MENRO Staff. Hence, it was facilitated solely by the IEC Team of the Office aside from three other colleagues

or seven (7) in all as facilitating staff. To **Whom**, the activity was catered to thirty-eight (38) residents in the community, composed of twenty-three (23) females, fifteen (15) males, and thirteen of them were senior citizens. Those that have kids with them, and those with little disabilities were given special assistance in compliance to GAD and Senior Citizens and like special programs of the government (Figure 2 and see attached copy of Attendance Sheets).

Why:

The need of IEC is justified by the familiar phrase ‘You shall know the truth and the truth shall set you free!’. Responsible Law Enforcement and Compliance Monitoring have to be twinned with the same responsibility of catering/spreading the information, education, and very good communication. Another maxim hereon is that ‘prevention is better than cure’.

How:

To the best possible the team could serve, the discussion was holistic from ridge to reef. In the lecturer’s terms, “Ang lahat ng bagay ay magkagnay, mula sa kabundukan, papunta sa kapatagan, sunod sa lusayan, at panghuli sa bahura”. It was a fulfilling day noting the hearers attentively participate, and respond to the lectures of herein EcoMS II Ana Liza D. Marasigan, and Forest Technician I/Information Officer Rodel M. Dorado. Other staff members were at the sidelines promptly responding to specific queries. Part of **How** was giving sorts of rewards to those who recited during the lectures. The items may be tiny but meant to send message that the endeavour is a community friendly.

Ms Marasigan very satisfactorily interacted with the group on Climate Change, Environmental Protection/Degradation; other environmental laws, and let the audience respond to issues and concerns. Accordingly, mangroves are unsung heroes that provide immeasurable benefits from their role in fisheries to climate change mitigation. It serves as the first line of defense from storm surges, waves and floods. It also serves as breeding



ground of different species and sequester carbon up to three times than terrestrial forests. She reminded to refrain from burning garbage and farm wastes as it contribute to air pollution and is a health hazard Figure 3).

Meanwhile, FT I Dorado discussed the salient provision of Presidential Decree 705 or the Revised Forestry Reform Code, with emphases on Sections 77, 78, 80, and 81 which have the corresponding penalties under Articles 309 and 301 of the Revised Penal Code. He also emphasized Section 5 Republic Act No. 9175 or the Chainsaw Act (Figure 4). In the same way, he provide the list of Certificate of Stewardship Contract (CSC) holders covering areas in the locality due for evaluation and assessment tentatively on March 9 to 10, 2023 to determine which could qualify for renewal or cancellation.

Other matters

Further, the activity was compliant to the Implementation Plan of the Office on Environmental Management System (EMS), basically the 5S technique of the organization, namely: 1. Sort, 2. Set in Order, 3. Shine, 4. Standardize, and 5. Sustain. The team also distributed posters and locally produced pamphlets on environmental laws (Fig 5).
