Dear Ms. Junybiebe Kay:

Please be informed that on 22 February 2023, the technical personnel of CENRO-Coron confirmed that you have been developing in salvage zone that causes destruction to the mangrove ecosystem and destructive modification of the landscape of Barangay Sto. Niňo, Busuanga, Palawan.

The above-cited destruction of mangroves is a violation of the following provisions of environmental laws and regulations to wit:

- a. Presidential Decree No. 1067 also known as "Water Code of the Philippines" specifically Article 51 states that:
 - "The bank of the rivers and streams and the shores of the seas and lakes throughout their entire length and within a zone of three (3) meters in urban areas, twenty (20) meters in agricultural areas and Forty (40) meters in forest areas, along their margins are subject to the easement of public use in the interest of recreation, navigation, floatage, fishing and salvage. No person shall be allowed to build structures any kind."
- b. Proclamation No. 2152 Declaring the entire Province of Palawan and certain parcels of the public domain and/or parts of the country as "Mangrove Swamp Reserves" pronouncing withdraw from entry, sale, settlement or other forms of disposition, subject to valid private rights, if any there be,
- c. Presidential Decree No. 705, Section 43

"Swamplands and mangrove Forests bordering numerous lands which protects the shoreline, the shoreline roads and even coastal communities from the destructive force of the sea during high winds and typhoons, shall be maintained and shall not be alienated. Such strips must be kept free from artificial obstruction so that flood water will flow unimpeded to the sea to avoid flooding or inundation of cultivated areas in the upstream...xxx"

In addition, this office would like to inform you that an existing **CEASE AND DESIST ORDER** that was issued to your company is still in effect, thus you are ordered to refrain from further developing in the area. You are also advised to comply with the legal documents for the said development to avoid violation of the above provisions of our environmental laws.

Please be guided accordingly. Thank you.

BARANGAY SANTO NIÑO, BUSUANGA, PALAWAN

Under Travel Order No. 2023-003, the undersigned conducted a site investigation last 22 February 2023 in Brgy. Santo Niño, Busuanga, Palawan. This is in response to the verbal complaint from Punong Barangay Ernesto G. Lopez, through a CENRO-Coron personnel, last 20 February 2023.

Background Information

Based on the complaint of Hon. Lopez, Pearl Bay Villas has been excavating aggregates along the coast to construct a new building in their resort. Hon. Lopez requested CENRO-Coron to investigate the matter for legal action, if necessary.

Purpose and Scope

The undersigned conducted the fieldwork to investigate the alleged extraction of aggregates and other operations in the area. The investigation includes an ocular inspection of the site, photo documentation, a verbal interview with the private property owner, barangay personnel, and Al Faro owner, and apprehension, if necessary.

Findings and Observations




Figure 1. Location map of the investigated excavation of aggregates in Pearl Bay Villas, Brgy. Santo Niño, Busuanga, Palawan.

1. The subject area is Pearl Bay Villas, Brgy. Santo Niño, Busuanga, Palawan. It is geographically situated at 12° 1'17.83"N, 119°58'48.03"E (Figure 1). It is approximately 35 kilometers from CENRO, which is reachable by a 45-minute motorcycle ride followed by a 10-minute speed boat ride (Photo 1).

- 2. The undersigned went to the Barangay Hall of Brgy. Santo Niño before the investigation for a courtesy call with Hon. Lopez. However, Hon. Lopez has already proceeded to the subject area with his team.
- 3. Upon arrival in the subject area, Pearl Bay Villas has posted a Building Permit dated 16 February 2023, issued by Mr. Edilberto Gatchalian, Building Official of the Municipality of Busuanga, with the project title: *Proposed Commercial/Resto Bar* (Annex 1).
- 4. The proposed commercial/restobar is 24m x 6m (Annex 2).
- 5. Pearl Bay Villas is owned by Ms. Junybiebe B. Kay who is currently residing overseas. She is represented by Ms. Rosalie F. Polanguy, through a Special Power of Attorney (SPA). The undersigned proceeded to interview Ms. Polanguy (Photo 2).
- 6. The undersigned requested Ms. Polanguy for a copy of the Barangay Clearance stating that the Barangay agrees to the construction of the *restobar* (Annex 3). Upon confirmation with Hon. Lopez, he mentioned that he provided the barangay clearance to Ms. Polanguy to process the building permit requirements for Strategic Environment Plan (SEP) clearance and not for the construction of the *restobar*. However, both the barangay clearance and building permit were dated 16 February 2022. Thus, Ms. Polanguy did not have consent from the barangay to start constructing the *restobar*.
- 7. A noticeable ground clearing can be observed in the area. Pearl Bay Villas is already working on the foundation of the building and aggregates have already been excavated from the subject area. They will also create a riprap where the building will be constructed (Photo 3). Only a concrete mixer was present in the area.

- 8. Sacks of aggregates were also seen in the subject area (**Photo 4**). Ms. Polanguy stated that he bought these from a nearby quarry permittee. However, Ms. Polanguy provided no receipt or document to the undersigned.
- 9. On the same day, a letter was received by Ms. Polanguy, dated 14 February 2023, signed by CENR Officer Rodney Verian, to temporarily stop/desist any activities or engaging in any operation/s since the establishment is within timberland/forestland and has been verified to be operating without any approved tenurial instrument (Annex 4).
- 10. The undersigned also requested documentation of complaints received by the barangay regarding the operations and activities conducted by Pearl Bay Villas. CENRO-Coron received such from the barangay on 02 March 2023 with the following documents (see attached file):

Comments and Recommendations

- 1. The Pearl Bay Villas was already ordered by CENRO-Coron to temporarily stop/desist any activities until they have secured their tenurial instrument. Ms. Polanguy was already advised to comply with such requirements.
- 2. Regarding the extraction and deposition of aggregates, it is also recommended that Pearl Bay Villas be issued a Cease-and-Desist Order (CDO) order for the construction, clearing, and ripraping activities.

To reiterate, the extraction and deposition of sand and gravel violates Section 103 of the Republic Act 7942, otherwise known as the Philippine Mining Act of 1995:

Theft of Minerals. - Any person extracting minerals and disposing the same without a mining agreement, lease, permit, license, or steals minerals or ores or the products thereof from mines or mills or processing plants shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned from six (6) months to six (6) years or pay a fine from Ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00) to Twenty thousand pesos (P20,000.00), or both, at the discretion of the appropriate court. In addition,

he shall be liable to pay damages and compensation for the minerals removed, extracted, and disposed of.

Furthermore, the extracted materials are considered illegally sourced mineral/mineral products. Based on Section 116 Chapter XII of DAO 2010-21,

Illegally-sourced minerals/mineral products are those which are mined, extracted, removed and/or disposed of without authority or permit under existing mining laws, rules and regulations.

3. In view of DENR Administrative Order No. 2021-07 or the *Guidelines on the Establishment of Legal Easements Along the Seas, Rivers, Lakes, Esteros, and Creeks* the following shall be strictly implemented and adhered to by the Pearl Bay Villas:

Section 5.2 of DAO 2021-007 states that rural municipalities shall adopt a **40-meter** easement zone on forest lands. Furthermore, in Section 6.1, the measurement of legal easement, lands bordering the seas, gulfs, bays or ports shall be subjected to easement of salvage zone of **40 meters in forest lands measured landwards from** the Mean High Water line or interior limit of the shoreline.

Thus, private individuals or entities owning or managing establishments that violate the rules on the establishment of salvage zones and legal easements shall be subject to possible relocation and demolition, if warranted.

- 4. Ms. Polanguy is also advised to visit CENRO-Coron to comply with pertinent documents and necessary permits.
- Regular monitoring is recommended to ensure that no illegal extraction or other
 activities will happen in the area. At the same time, Pearl Bay Villas shall comply
 with all requirements and pertinent documents requested by this office and other
 concerned agencies.




Photo 1. 10-minute speed boat ride going to the subject area.







