INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to Executive Order No. 263 and DENR Administrative Order (DAO) 96-29, the Community Based Forest Management (CBFM) was adopted as the national strategy to ensure sustainable development of the country's forestland resources. Under this program, the Community-Based Forest Management Agreement (CBFMA) is entered into between the government and partner Peoples Organizations (POs).

On December 10, 2001, Limon Sur Upland Farmer Producers Association (then Limon Sur Producers Cooperative) was awarded with 61.10 hectares of land through Community Based Forest Management Agreement located in Sitio Lumbia, Brgy. Limon Sur, Looc, Romblon. The association has a total of 44 members, 32 of which are male and 12 are female. Majority of these participants are active and is led by the President, Mr. Rogelio G. Sarceno.

Limon Sur Upland Farmer Producers Association is an organization registered to the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) with registration No. 011-793. It has also an updated GIS map while its Community Resource Management Framework (CRMF) and Five Year Work Plan (FYWP) was updated last year and it is for affirmation. There were sixteen (16) Certificate of Stewardship Contract issued on August 30, 1984.

Periodic monitoring is conducted to know the status of the projects, development and other related CBFM activities within the area.

Forest Management Bureau (FMB) Technical Bulletin No. 20 known as the Enhanced Guidelines and Procedures in the Preparation/Updating of the Community Resource Management Framework (CRMF) and Five-Year Work Plan for the CBFMA

DENR Administrative Order No. 2021-17 entitled "Guidelines for the Affirmation of the Community Resource Management Framework (CRMF) and Approval of Five-Year Work Plan (FYWP) of the Holders of Community-Based Forest Management Agreement (CBFMA)

EXISTING RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT IN THE CBFM AREA

In 2012, almost 8.72 hectares of land was planted with high value crops like cacao, coffee (robusta) and calamansi; fruit bearing and forest trees to guarantee food security, environmental stability and enhance climate change mitigation.

In 2019, to further augment the source of income and improve the living condition of the CBMF beneficiaries, Agroforestry Development was implemented in the area. About 10.0 hectares was cultivated and planted with agricultural crops, mixed with fruit bearing and forest trees.

Through the CARP project in 2019, two (2) carabaos were awarded to the POs. Its internal arrangement for tending and use of the said animal is at least two years per member. A calf was born last 2021 and another calf was about to born this year.

Various initiatives and practices were also adapted by some recipients. Vacant areas was used for planting root crops, vegetables and the like. Coconuts was also grown in the area as they considered as the "tree of life" because it can provide almost anything – from food to industrial needs. They harvested coconut twice a year and made into copra, another good source of income.
