
Submitted herewith is the report on the monthly status of NGP targets and accomplishments in the identified Barangays under NTF-ELCAC as of November 2022.

Be informed that NGP projects within identified Barangays under NTF-ELCAC have an aggregate total area for development of 802.5 hectares located in seven (7) ELCAC Barangays, in **Cabacao, Naibuan, Batasan** in Occidental Mindoro, **Milagrosa, San Isidro** in Oriental Mindoro, **Salogon, and Samariniana** in Palawan with 194 engaged families.

Relative thereto, a total area of 784.64 hectares with 386,800 seedlings is being maintained under the jurisdiction of PENRO Oriental Mindoro, Occidental Mindoro and PENRO Palawan. Moreover, 2nd year maintenance and protection activities within PENRO Oriental Mindoro have been completed by ENGP Partners for the second semester target .

As to the financial status, a total of Php 869,970.50 of contracted amount was disbursed by PENRO Palawan and PENRO Oriental Mindoro.

Enclosed is the consolidated data in table for the Provinces of Oriental Mindoro, Occidental Mindoro and Palawan with identified ELCAC Barangays using the revised prescribed format for information and record.



Respectfully submitted is the Memorandum dated March 24, 2023 of PENRO Oriental Mindoro regarding the above-mentioned subject.

The 1st Quarter reports include analysis of data generated from the five (5) installed intruments within Mag-Asawang Tubig and Bongabong River Watersheds. These instruments were installed to serve as early warning device to nearby communities which are prone to flooding.

The data generated by an Automated Weather Station (AWS) in a built-up area differs greatly from that generated by an AWS in a mountainous area. The latter receives less solar radiation and receives more precipitation, whereas the former receives more solar radiation and receives less precipitation. Every rainfall event also causes aquifer recharge. To determine the direct relationship between factors, data was correlated. This further reveals the data issues, such as the soil moisture versus rainfall in Macatoc-AWS. The data problems encountered must be corrected with the assistance of a technical expert from the DENR Central Office. As soon as the Automated Water Level Monitoring Station in Abaton Bridge, Barangay Parang, Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro is repaired, the flooding likelihood will be examined.

This is in completion of accomplishment in compliance with target activity under the Natural Resources Conservation and Development Program - Protected Areas, Caves, and Wetlands Development Sub-Program: Integrated Protected Area Fund – Fees and income collected and utilization of fund under PA-RIA (75%) and IPAF-SAGF (25%) of Naujan Lake National Park (NLNP) in Oriental Mindoro.

Per report of the Special Collecting Officer of the Naujan Lake National Park-Protected Area Management Office (NLNP-PAMO), a total amount of twenty thousand and four hundred pesos (P20,400.00) was collected in the 3rd Quarter CY 2022 (July to September 2022) from fishing permit fees of fisherfolks from Brgy. Leido, San Narciso, Brgy. Duongan, Victoria, and Brgy. Tagbakin, Pola, Oriental Mindoro.

Additionally, a total amount of fifteen thousand and four hundred pesos (P15,400.00) was collected in the 4th Quarter CY 2022 (October to December 2022) from fishing permit fees of fisherfolks from Brgys. Malabo and Duongan, Victoria, Oriental Mindoro.

Seventy-five percent (75%) of the total collection was deposited to the IPAF-Retained Income Account (IPAF-RIA), while twenty-five percent (25%) was remitted to the IPAF-Special Account in the General Fund (IPAF-SAGF) through the Landbank of the Philippines, broken down in the following table:

Respectfully submitted herewith are the source documents of the accomplished activities of DENR MIMAROPA Region - Licenses Patents and Deeds Division - Wildlife Resources Permitting Section for CY 2022.

This office had issued eight hundred twenty-two (822) Wildlife Export Certificates, six (6) Wildlife Farm Permit (WFP), five (5) Wildlife Collectors Permit (WCP) and four (4) Wildlife Gratuitous Permits for the year 2022.

As of December 31, 2022, a total of seventeen (17) approved and existing wildlife farm permits was issued for the province of Marinduque and Oriental Mindoro. One of which is a monkey breeding farm while the other sixteen are butterfly/moth breeding farms.

Twelve (12) of the wildlife farm permittees are engaged in exporting live butterfly/moth pupae and deadstocks. Forty-five (45) different butterfly and moth species thru the issued wildlife export certifications were exported in the forms of pupae and dead stocks for commercial purposes to different countries within Asia, Europe, and America. *Papilio lowi* tops the list of the most frequently exported species followed by *Hypolimnas bolina*, *Papilio palinurus*, *Idea leuconoe*, and *Graphium agamemnon* among others.

Wildlife gratuitous permits were issued to the following, namely:

1. University of Santo Tomas c/o Leonardo A. Guevarra, Jr., MSc.
2. Southern Luzon State University c/o Abigal Marbella & Reisel Ruth Regio
3. De La Salle University – Dasmariñas c/o Arriane Grace M. Revilla
4. Adamson University c/o Patricia Ashley Rosales

This office thru LPDD-WRPS also conducted consultative meetings and deliberations relative to issuance of wildlife permits. Consultative meetings conducted focused on the following:

- a. Status of butterfly/moth farms operation within Marinduque and compliance of the permittees on the conditions of their permits

- b. Review/revisit/clarification of existing rules and regulations on processing/issuance of wildlife-related permits; status of pending applications for WFP within Oriental Mindoro; status of wildlife under issued CWR within Oriental Mindoro
- c. Orientation/Workshop with wildlife farm permittees re implementation of Online Application System for WEC
- d. RWMC deliberation of applications for Renewal of WFPs

One of the major accomplishments of this office is the orientation and implementation of the online application system for Wildlife Export Certification (Export Permit) which this office has already been using officially since October 2022. The objective of the system is to provide convenience to clientele minimizing their efforts and expenses in travel and to fast track issuance of the certification using online platform. Prior to implementation, series of meetings, consultations and dry runs were conducted to address errors and further improve full operation of the system.

Insofar as the region is concerned, the total revenue collected from the issuance of aforementioned wildlife permits and certifications for 2022 amounted to six hundred eighty-one thousand six hundred fifty-one pesos and eleven centavos (**Php 681,651.11**).

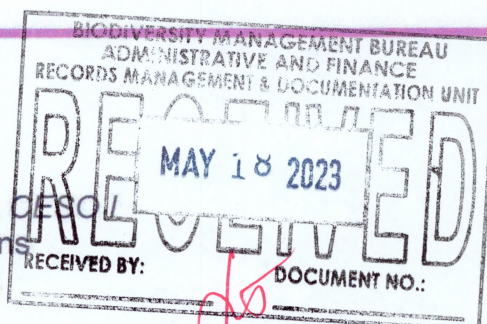

Rehabilitation/Maintenance of PA Management Office and other ecotourism facilities within the PA including signages in Naujan Lake National Park (NLNP) in Oriental Mindoro.

The following facilities were maintained/monitored by the NLNP-Protected Area Management Office (NLNP-PAMO):

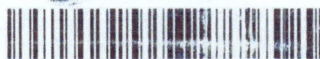
- Bangklase in Bayani, Naujan.
- Two (2) Cottages and comfort rooms in Pungao Hotspring, Montelago, Naujan
- Malabo View Deck, Malabo, Victoria
- Protected Area Management Office, Pasi II, Socorro

Water levels in NLNP were observed to be high during the first quarter, submerging the surroundings of the Malabo View Deck, Pungao Hotspring in Montelago, and Bayani, Naujan where the Bangklase is temporarily docked. Further, monitoring of cottages and comfort rooms near Tagbakin Falls in Brgy. Tagbakin, Pola, is rescheduled for the 2nd Quarter Monitoring since planned visits were obstructed by unfavorable weather. Repair and maintenance of the Malabo View Deck, parts of the PAMO, cottages, and comfort rooms will be prioritized in line with the targets of NLNP for the following quarters.

This refers to the attached Confiscation Order dated January 25, 2016 issued by then Regional Director Oscar C. Dominguez, the dispositive portion of which reads:

WHEREFORE, FOREGOING PREMISES CONSIDERED, the apprehended 2,979 pcs. of lumber of Ipil, Nato and Apitong species having a total volume of about 75.01 cu. m. (31,811.07 bd. ft.) with an estimated fair market value of about Php 3,074,495.00 are hereby **ORDERED CONFISCATED** in favor of the government to be disposed of in accordance with existing DENR laws, rules and regulations governing the matter.

The CENRO Puerto Princesa City is hereby directed to follow up the Petition for Review filed before the Office of the Secretary – Department of Justice, attend the hearing on the Motion to Quash Search Warrant filed by Mr. Peter Schultz at the Regional Trial Court, and to inform/furnish the Court a copy of this Confiscation Order.

SO ORDERED.

On December 10, 2018, a Resolution dismissing the Motion for Reconsideration filed by herein respondent was issued by then Regional Executive Director Henry A. Adornado, Ph.D., the dispositive portion of which reads:

WHEREFORE, premises considered, the instant Motion for Reconsideration is **DENIED**. The Decision dated January 25, 2016 of this Office is hereby **AFFIRMED IN TOTO**.
