
Respectfully submitted herewith is the consolidated apprehension report of Monitoring and Enforcement Section of this Office. Anent the actual volume of apprehended undocumented forest products for the first quarter target based on the Approved Work and Financial Plan for CY 2023.


As per reports submitted, a total of **1,162.67** board feet of undocumented forest products (lumber, and poles) were apprehended by the Joint Operation of personnel of PNP Balabac, 2<sup>nd</sup> SOU-MG Balabac, DENR Balabac Sub-Office and RioTuba Monitoring station of DENR-CENRO Brooke's Point. Based on the record the total apprehended Forest product is equivalent to **61.5%** of the total target for the quarter which is **1,890** board feet. However the equivalent apprehended volume of Forest product to date had recorded board feet **1,162.67** or **15.4%** of the total target which **7,560** board feet for annual target.

Strengthening of linkages and continuous coordination with other concerned agencies and the intensified forest protection activities undertaken by the Monitoring Enforcement Section personnel of this Office reduced volume and incidences of apprehension. Moreover, the filing of cases against the identified violators/perpetrators during the previous years is a great factor in increasing the community public awareness/realization re: the importance of forest in facing with the global warming and also the office efficiently implementing our existing environmental laws and policies. Likewise, Information Education and Communication Campaign/Activities have been intensified and regularly being conducted.

Further, aside from patrolling, monitoring and surveillance activities, existing livelihood programs such as NGP projects were introduced and established within the four (4) municipalities under the jurisdiction of this Office. In addition, continues coordination to the other law enforcement agencies through created of Multi Sectoral Forest Protection Committee in the Municipalities of Bataraza, Palawan had been crucial specifically in the determination and detection of illegal activities in a particular area.


