The BDFE Program intends to cover terrestrial protected areas and other conservation areas in consideration of the lessons learned from its implementation in marine PAs. As part of this effort, the Bureau conducted the first Orientation for the PAMO personnel in selected terrestrial protected areas, including representatives from CDD, through virtual platform in CY 2022. To ensure that field implementers are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively implement the BDFE Program, it is essential to provide continuous and periodic orientation through various workshops and learning events.

One of the goals of the Bureau is to expand the BDFE Program to cover terrestrial protected areas and other conservation areas in consideration of the lessons learned from its implementation in marine PAs. As part of this effort, the Bureau conducted the first Orientation for the PAMO personnel in selected terrestrial protected areas, including representatives from CDD, through virtual platform in CY 2022.

The previous Orientation provided an overview of the key features of DAO 2021-13 and shared experiences and lessons learned from the field, specifically from the POs. To ensure that field implementers are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively implement the BDFE Program, it is essential to provide continuous and periodic orientation through various workshops and learning events. This will enable the field offices to fully understand the guidelines and implement them in a manner that aligns with the objectives of the BDFE program.

The BDFE Program includes understanding how the Business Development Services (BDS) fit into the whole market system and the processes along the value chain that may be critical in biodiversity conservation and the management of communities and their enterprises within and adjacent to PAs and conservation areas. Therefore, BDS and enterprise development are essential components of the BDFE capacity development.

In view of the above, the Bureau is organizing a face-to-face Orientation on DAO 2021-13 or the Guidelines for the Development and Recognition of Biodiversity-Friendly Enterprises (BDFE) for its Implementation in Terrestrial Ecosystems and Refresher Course on Business Development Services (BDS). This will help ensure that field implementers are equipped with the relevant and helpful information and knowledge to implement the BDFE program effectively, while also strengthening their understanding of the critical roles of BDS in biodiversity conservation and sustainable economic development.

#### **Objectives**

The objective of this learning event is to provide orientation to DENR regional and field offices as well as key personnel from the DENR central office on the salient features of the DAO 2021-13 or the Guidelines on BDFE Development and Recognition, and the Key Concepts of BDS for BDFE. Specifically, the learning event, aims to achieve the following:

- 1. Level-off and enhance the appreciation and understanding of the principles, procedures and processes involved in the development and recognition of BDFEs in NIPAS PAs and other conservation areas;
- 2. Understand the salient provisions of the DAO including its Annexes;
- 3. Increase appreciation and understanding of the implementation of BDFE as a tool for biodiversity management and conservation; and
- 4. Increase knowledge, appreciation and understanding of the BDS in relation to enterprise development.

# Mechanics and Strategies

- The Orientation on BDFE and BDS refresher course will be conducted in three (3) clusters, lasting for 3 days. It will consist of a combination of lectures, workshops, and interactive games/skits.
- Members of the BMB BDFE Core Group will serve as Resource Persons and Secretariat during the Workshop. Consultants who were previously engaged in the BDS Orientation for the Coastal and Marine personnel will also be invited as resource persons.
- The Program will be divided into two parts:
  - Presentation of the BDFE Guidelines or the DAO 2021-13 and its Annexes including the policy consultation on the draft guidelines for Screening of Proposals for the BDFE Financial Assistance; and
  - Presentation of BDS Modules 1 to 5.
- The first part of each cluster will include the discussion of the processes and procedures in undertaking the various assessments of existing

livelihoods and enterprises within and adjacent PAs and conservation areas; the processes involved in appraisal of enterprises, and the details of the ten (10) Annexes. Highlights of each section will be presented and elaborated. The first part also includes the presentation of the draft guidelines on the Screening of Proposals for the BDFE Financial Assistance, of at least one (1) hour to solicit comments and feedback from the participants. While the second part will be allocated on the elaboration of the key concepts of BDS and how it is connected to BDFE and how it contributes in attaining inclusive and sustainable development. After each presentation, 30 minutes will be allotted for an open forum to express clarifications and encourage sharing of first hand experiences on the ground and practices. Around 30 to 35 participants are expected to join the learning event excluding the resource persons and secretariat per cluster. Over-all, around 50 to 55 attendees are expected to participate in the learning event. An evaluation survey will be administered to all participants through Google Forms after each session. strictly observed by the participants and the trainers, respectively:
